2. Chairman Calvin James stated that the Parish Engineer provided everyone with a copy of the previous Road Improvement Program list indicating the roads done and the cost. He then stated that the Engineer is requesting that the Jurors prioritize five (5) roads and submit so he can begin obtaining a cost estimate.
3. Chairman Calvin James recognized the Parish Manger regarding the hiring of an operator due to the number of retirees. In response, the Parish Manager stated that applications are being accepted and he will get with the Road & Bridge and Personnel Committee Chairman and conduct interviews.
4. Chairman Calvin James recognized the Parish Engineer regarding Andras St. Concrete Project. In response, the Parish Engineer stated that he met with the Contractor in regards to negotiation for a reduction in cost and to consider the reduction in the scope of work to meet the budget. He then requested authorization to accept the bid subject to the change in scope and the price falling within the budget amount.
5. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the committee authorize the Parish Engineer to negotiate contract cost for Andras St. Concrete Project and accept the bid subject to the change in scope of work and bid falling within budget." 1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Irving Comeaux, Chairman; Mr. Patrick Lawless, Mr. Jeff Naquin, Mr. Martin Triche.  
Committee member recorded as absent was: Mr. Henry Dupre.  
Other Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Calvin James, Mr. Booster Breaux, Mr. Myron Matherne.
2. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, "THAT, the committee grant preliminary approval on Survey and Re-subdivision of Tracts A & B of Ingleside Plantation for Peltier Warehouse, Inc., Stephen G. Peltier Family, LLC and Lafourche Sugars, LLC." The motion was unanimously adopted.
3. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee approve to call for public hearing on September 10, 2014 for the Survey and Re-subdivision of Tracts A & B of Ingleside Plantation for Peltier Warehouse, Inc., Stephen G. Peltier Family, LLC and Lafourche Sugars, LLC." The motion was unanimously adopted.
4. Committee member Patrick Lawless offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee approve a letter of 'No Objection' for Chevron Phillips Chemical Company proposed deep hole anode ground bed and anode electrical cable." The motion was unanimously adopted.
5. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized Martha Cazaubon of South Central Planning, who stated that the Office of Community Development will allow the purchase of property for the Bertrandville Sewer Project (lift station). She stated that they are requiring that the Jury provide documents indicating the reason for the purchase of entire lot. She also stated that the survey of the property will be done next week.
6. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the Parish Engineer, who stated that the Landowners of Lucky Hit Plantation Partnership granted a new right of way and request that the Police Jury approve the amendment. Following a brief discussion, the committee agreed that once the amended right of way is plated and a copy of the agreement is presented, the approval will be granted.
7. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the Grants Coordinator, who stated that each member received a copy of the LGAP allocations for the past 10 yrs. She stated that the allocation amount is \$100,000 with \$25,000 earmarked for the Village of Napoleonville. She then requested that the Jury discuss and submit potential projects by the meeting of September 24, 2014. She further stated that the allocation would be revealed.
8. The Grants Coordinator stated that the RESTORE Act is federal funding for gulf coast restoration and Louisiana has been placed in the coastal zone. She gave a list of categories for potential projects and stated that it's difficult to discuss a project when the funding amount is not certain. A brief discussion was held regarding the Act and the possible use of current land use plan that can be submitted for approval and certification.  
In response, the OEP Director informed the committee that this funding is fines from the BP oil spill.
9. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the OEP Director, who stated that the following is an update on all Disaster Recovery Grants:
  - Napoleonville Drainage Project – Substantial completion has been given and the 45 day lien period is near complete and the punch list will be addressed.
  - Cancienne Canal Project – The project is in the public comments period for the Coastal Use permit. Once completed, phase II of engineering plans will begin. Once approved, the project will move forward to bid.
  - Bertrandville Sewer Project – Once the land acquisition is complete, the Parish Engineer will meet with the contractor to get the change order and the project can move forward.
  - Peterville Sewer Project – The Parish Engineer stated that he met with the land owner and the right of way area has been surveyed. Once completed, it will be turned over to Mrs. Janet Daigle. Once the title is legally acquired the project will move forward and go out for bid.
  - Marais Sewer Project – The Parish Engineer stated that he would like to table this matter until Juror Patrick Johnson arrives.
  - Ewell/Virginia St. Waterline Project – The award letter has been received and authorization is needed to advertise for bid.

10. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, 'THAT, the committee approve and authorized the advertising for bid the Ewell/Virginia St. Waterline Project.' The motion was unanimously adopted.
- Belle River Water Line – Waiting for the Coastal Use Permit. Received e-mail from the Coastal Use Office and they are waiting on the letter of 'No Objection' from the Corp of Engineers. He then stated that after contacting the Corp of Engineers, they informed that they are in the final stage of releasing the permit to Coastal Use.
  - Critical Infrastructure Generators – Will receive and review the bids next week and awaiting the MOU's with two (2) of the Fire Departments.  
The Parish Engineer informed that the pre-bid conference was held on August 25, 2014 at 9 a.m. in the OEP Office and an addendum was made to extend the bid date an additional two (2) weeks to issue clarifications and to suggest reduction in cost.
  - Sewer Generator Project – The Parish Engineer has submitted the plans but waiting on the completion of a few other projects to determine the funding amount.
  - Bayou L'Ourse Boat Launch Project – The ERR advertisement ends on September 2, 2014 and authorization should follow to proceed.  
The Parish Engineer stated that the plans were originally submitted under LA Solutions for approval. He stated that Pan American is handling the matter and revisions were required. He stated that the revisions were made and will be submitted at the end of the week for final review.
  - Pump Station Project - The Parish Engineer stated that the final plans and specifications have been submitted to GOHSEP and we are awaiting approval.
  - The Safe Room for the Road & Bridge Department - A meeting will be held on tomorrow with the architectural service and GOHSEP to start project.
  - CIAP Project – The Parish Engineer stated that they are awaiting the Coastal Use and Corp of Engineers permit. The Attakapas Landing 30 day public comment period is complete and no adverse comments were received. He then stated that they are waiting to start the 30-day comment period Lake Verret Project
  - Hwy 1 Linear Park – The Parish Engineer stated that he met with committee member Martin Triche to discuss the change in scope of the project since it is different with the Corp of Engineers dredging the bayou. He stated that the bulkhead may not be allowed therefore they discussed the removal of the bulkhead and move the project further up the embankment still meeting all the necessary requirements of the grant.
  - EPA Wastewater Generator - Plans have been submitted.
  - Belle Rose Library – The Grants Coordinator stated that they did a walk thru at the site and phase 1 is being redone.
11. The OEP Director stated that Mr. Hudson is still working on the mapping and has not submitted an update.
12. The OEP Director then stated that additional wells are being installed in Bayou Corne and in particular Texas Brine is proposing to place one (1) on Sportsman Drive to deplete the gas more efficiently. He stated that there are two wells on the far east side that are being proposed, plugged and abandoned because they that never produced any gas but they have met the monitoring period requirements. He stated that everyone was made aware through the Blog the concerns of Oxi 2's location. He then gave an update on Oxi 3, the cavern that failed, and stated that it has not been in operation for a few weeks. In response to the recent odor concerns, he stated that they inspected all possible areas and could not locate the cause. It's been noted as an unknown source.
13. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, "THAT, there being no further business to come before the Engineering/Grants Committee, the meeting be adjourned." The motion was unanimously adopted.

1. The Regular Meeting of the Assumption Parish Police Jury was called to order by Police Jury President Martin Triche in the Assumption Parish Police Jury Chamber located at 4813 Highway 1, Napoleonville, Louisiana.
2. Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Patrick Lawless, Ward 1; Mr. Jeff Naquin, Ward 2; Mr. Irving Comeaux, Ward 3; Mr. Patrick Johnson, Ward 4; Mr. Martin Triche, Ward 5; Mr. Calvin James, Ward 6; Mr. Booster Breaux, Ward 8; Mr. Myron Matherne, Ward 9.  
Police Juror recorded as absent was: Mr. Henry Dupre, Ward 7.
3. President Martin Triche led the Prayer and Police Juror Calvin James led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.
4. Police Juror Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the minutes of August 13, 2014." The motion was unanimously adopted.
5. Police Juror Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Johnson, "THAT, the Police Jury approve payment of the bills submitted through August 22, 2014." The motion was unanimously adopted.
6. President Martin Triche opened the meeting to the public for any public comments, questions or concerns regarding the items listed on the agenda. Following three (3) calls, there were no comments received.
7. President Martin Triche recognized Drainage Committee Vice-Chairman Myron Matherne, who stated the committee met and recommended the following matters; \$500 for 215 Cherry St. Catchbasin Project, \$1,000 for Hwy 662 Catchbasin Project, \$2,100 for Hwy 401 Outfall Project, \$500 for Hwy 403 & King St. Catchbasin Project, \$2,400 for 100 Mam & Pap St. Culvert Replacement Project, \$2,600 for Riverbend St. Culvert Replacement Project.
8. Police Juror Myron Matherne offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Calvin James, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Drainage Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted.
9. President Martin Triche recognized Road & Bridge Committee Chairman Calvin James, who stated that the committee met and discussed the 2015 Road Overlay Program. The committee accepted the recommendation of the Parish Engineer to submit 5 priority streets as soon as possible so that he can obtain a cost estimate. He also stated that the committee authorized the Parish Engineer to meet with the contractor for Andras St. Concrete Project to negotiate the contract cost and a possible reduction and accept the bid subject to the change in scope of work and bid falling within budget.
10. Police Juror Calvin James offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Irving Comeaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Road & Bridge Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted.
11. President Martin Triche recognized Engineering/Grants Committee Chairman Irving Comeaux, who stated that the committee met and recommended the following: preliminary approval on Survey and Re-subdivision of Tracts A & B of Ingleside Plantation for Peltier Warehouse, Inc., Stephen G. Peltier Family, LLC and Lafourche Sugars, LLC, call for public hearing on September 10, 2014 for the Survey and Re-subdivision of Tracts A & B of Ingleside Plantation for Peltier Warehouse, Inc., Stephen G. Peltier Family, LLC and Lafourche Sugars, LLC, approved a letter of 'No Objection' for Chevron Phillips Chemical Company proposed deep hole anode ground bed and anode electrical cable, received approval from the Office of Community Development to purchase property for the Bertrandville Sewer Project (lift station), discussed previous LGAP projects and agreed to submit potential projects at the next meeting, discussed Disaster Recovery Grants and approved and authorized the advertising for bid the Ewell/Virginia St. Waterline Project, received an update on the FEMA and Bayou Corne situation.
12. Police Juror Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Engineering/Grants Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolutions attached)
13. President Martin Triche recognized Police Juror Patrick Johnson, who stated that many problems have arose with obtaining the right of ways for the Louis Lane Project and many complaints are being received with the Back Marais Sewer Plant therefore, he and the Parish Engineer have discussed eliminating the Louis Lane Project. He then stated that a cost estimate was drafted to utilize those funds for the Back Marais Sewer Plant and apply for funding through CDBG for Louis Lane.  
The Parish Engineer explained that the Parish currently applied under the regular CDBG Program for the closing of the Marais Oxidation Pond and replacement of a mechanical sewer plant. He

stated that it was denied due to the Louis Lane, Marais Sewer and Bertrandville Sewer Projects being opened underneath the Disaster Recovery Program and being held up by right of ways, title work, etc. He then stated that the Marais Oxidation Pond/land is 100% owned by the Parish. However, if allowed, a project amendment under Disaster Recovery Program is required and can be done. He further stated that the Parish would then be able to apply for the Marais/Louis Lane Project under the CDBG cycle in 2 yrs and all of the issues can be worked out by that time. In response, the OEP Director stated that a deadline needs to be met with the Disaster Recovery funds and with all the issues that the Parish is being faced with, the deadline won't be met and the funding could be lost. He further stated that the alternative plan can meet the deadline and be accomplished therefore he recommended that it be pursued.

14. Police Juror Patrick Johnson offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, "THAT, the Police Jury approve to amend the Disaster Recovery CDBG Program resending Louis Lane/Marais Sewer Treatment Project and add Marais Oxidation Pond Mechanical Plant." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached)
15. Police Juror Myron Matherne offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the Police Jury approve a resolution approving the holding of an election in Pierre Part Settlement Gravity Drainage District of the Parish of Assumption on Saturday, December 6, 2014 to authorize the levy of a parcel fee." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached)
16. Police Juror Myron Matherne offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the Police Jury approve a resolution approving the holding of an election in Bayou Pierre Part North Gravity Drainage District of the Parish of Assumption on Saturday, December 6, 2014 to authorize the levy of a parcel fee." ORDINANCE 14-18

Be It Ordained by the Assumption Parish Police Jury, convened in Regular Session on this 27th day of August 2014, that:

Section 1. The following properties, identified by assessment numbers, located within the Parish of Assumption, be levied with the stated charges due plus thirty percent for collection fees for non-payment of grass cutting, and said charges shall become an assessment and form part of the ad valorem taxes due on said property by the owner and when collected shall be credited to the general fund of the parish.

Such assessment when so filed and recorded shall operate as a lien and privilege against the property herein assessed, which lien and privilege shall rank from the date of filing of the assessment in the Mortgage Records of said Parish and shall prime all other claims, mortgages and liens, except taxes and prior recorded special assessment liens.

Section 3. If any section, clause, paragraph, provision or portion of this Ordinance shall be held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not affect any other section, clause, paragraph, provision or portion of this ordinance, the Police Jury of the Parish of Assumption hereby expressly declaring that it would have passed the remaining portions of this Ordinance with the invalid portions omitted.

Section 4. Other ordinances or parts of ordinance in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 5. This ordinance shall become effective immediately.

Section 6. This ordinance, having been submitted in writing, having been read and adopted by sections at a public meeting of said Police Jury was then submitted to an official vote as a whole, then vote thereon being as follows:

WHEREAS, The Assumption Parish Police Jury is amending the scope of the Marais Project funded through the Disaster Recovery Program to consist of putting in a new mechanical plant to replace the existing pond system located on French Lane, and

WHEREAS, the Assumption Parish Police Jury will then seek funding for the Louis Lane Sewer Improvement Project through the LCDBG program during the next submission cycle; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Assumption Parish Police Jury authorize the Police Jury President to negotiate and sign the required documents.
