1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Henry Dupre, Chairman; Mr. Myron Matherne, Mr. Irving Comeaux, Mr. Booster Breaux.
Committee members recorded as absent were: Mr. Calvin James, Mr. Martin Triche.
2. Committee member Myron Matherne offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Irving Comeaux, "THAT, the committee approve \$1,000 for Royal & Sharp St. Catchbasin Project utilizing a reallocation from project #91132." The motion was unanimously adopted.
3. Committee member Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, "THAT, the committee approve \$800 for Ann St. Culvert Replacement Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
4. Committee member Martin Triche entered the meeting at this time.
5. Chairman Henry Dupre recognized the Parish Manager, who stated that the way the Lower Texas Bridge was designed, the water is flowing towards the swamp. Therefore, Police Juror Patrick Johnson is requesting that a letter is sent to DOTD requesting that they reverse the flow of water at the bridge.
6. Committee member Myron Matherne offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Irving Comeaux, "THAT, the committee approve a resolution to DOTD requesting that they reverse the flow of water at the Lower Texas Bridge." The motion was unanimously adopted.
7. Chairman Henry Dupre recognized the Parish Manager, who stated that the Lower Texas Drainage system will consist of a new pump, powering up the pumps, building a deck, a new levee and a pump station. He stated that the \$18,000 allocation can get the project started but it will continue into next year.
8. Committee member Calvin James entered the meeting at this time.
9. Committee member Myron Matherne offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Irving Comeaux, "THAT, the committee approve \$18,000 for the Lower Texas Drainage System Project." The motion was unanimously adopted,
10. Chairman Henry Dupre recognized the Parish Manager, who stated that the safety and drainage concerns near the farmers loading area is becoming a hazard and Mr. Johnson would like to further discuss the matter at a later date. He then stated that they are still acquiring right of ways to perform the outfall clearing on Louis Lane and the wash out on Oakley Rd. near the embankment area.
11. Chairman Henry Dupre stated that the Lee Drive Bulkhead is for the Bayou Pierre Part North Drainage District. He stated that the low bid was \$44,466 and the cost incurred by the R & B Department will be \$3,300. He briefly explained the specifications of the project.
A brief discussion was then held regarding the details of the project. Following the discussion, Mr. Irving Comeaux mentioned the bulkhead on Sophie St. and how productive it has been and suggested that this be considered.
Chairman Henry Dupre explained how the project would be funded. A brief discussion was held regarding the cost of the projects, the bid process, and projects requiring an engineering design. He then requested that the matter be tabled until the regular meeting.
12. Committee member Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, "THAT, the committee approve \$500 for 137 Derrick St. Catchbasin Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
13. Police Juror Jeff Naquin entered the meeting at this time.
14. Committee member Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, "THAT, the following matter be added to the agenda." The motion was unanimously adopted.
15. Chairman Henry Dupre requested comments, questions, or concerns regarding a catchbasin at 130 Greenleaf Blvd. Following three (3) calls, there were no comments received.
16. Committee member Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, "THAT, the committee approve \$500 for 130 Greenleaf Blvd Catchbasin Project utilizing a reallocation from project #91132." The motion was unanimously adopted.

17. Committee member Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, 'THAT, there being no further business to come before the Drainage Committee, the meeting be adjourned.' The motion was unanimously adopted.

2. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the committee approve to pay the bills submitted through December 4, 2015." The motion was unanimously adopted,
3. Chairman Martin Triche recognized Mr. Guillot, who stated that the Harvest Luncheon was held on October 14, 2015 and was well attended. Engineering/Grants Committee Meeting
Of the
Assumption Parish Police Jury

Wednesday, December 9, 2015
5:30 O'clock p.m.

1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Irving Comeaux, Chairman; Mr. Henry Dupre, Mr. Jeff Naquin, Mr. Martin Triche.
Committee member recorded as absent was: Mr. Patrick Lawless.
Other Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Calvin James, Mr. Booster Breaux, Mr. Myron Matherne.
2. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized Ed Stock of C. J. Savoie's Office, who stated that the Secretary-Treasurer, Jurors Booster Breaux and Myron Matherne, had a conference call with the Parish Engineer and the Corp of Engineers to discuss the CIAP Project permit and the requirements for making adjustments to the proposed construction to fall within the budget and time constraints. He then requested suggestions on how to proceed.
The Secretary-Treasurer stated that this is the Lake Verret Swamp and Rim Restoration Coastal Impact Program. She stated that the budget is between \$4 and \$5 million and the cost estimate came in at approximately \$12-\$13. She then stated that the deadline for construction completion is September 2016 with no extension and all paperwork and documents would need to be closed out by December 2016. She further stated that everything is in order to begin but the question now is where would the spoils be placed and any revisions would require going back to the Corp of Engineers for an approval. She proceeded to give the timeline for completion of the project and stated that it won't be feasible to get done by the deadline date. Committee member Martin Triche stated that this is referencing the old Point A' Joe Project. He stated that if the Jury considers going forward with the project at a lesser scope it would have to have CIAP approval and the Corp of Engineering Permit. He then stated that he doesn't want time to lapse and the project won't be completed when the Bayou Lafourche Freshwater District is permitted as a part of the Louisiana State Master Plan and the funds can be re-directed to the State for an agreement with the Freshwater District to get their dredging project done up to Napoleonville.
A brief discussion was then held regarding the original scope and different suggestions to change the scope. Following the discussion, the committee agreed that the Parish Engineer submit the options that the Jury can discuss and then make a final decision.
3. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the Grants Coordinator, who stated that the RESTORE Act is funding related to the BP Oil Spill. She stated that at present, the Parish can apply for \$159,000, but not until we have a multi-year plan in place. She also informed the committee that there is no deadline for the plan and the amount of money from the suit is not known. She further explained that Assumption Parish will receive 1% of the settlement and the probable amount once the settlement is reached is about \$1.2 million. She added that this will not be received until 2017 and the Parish cannot create the plan for these funds until the settlement is completed. She stated that BP has approximately 15 yrs. to pay out these funds therefore, the Parish will be allocated approximately \$82,000 per year over this time period. The Grants Coordinator stated that a coastal restoration project would be the only viable project for Assumption Parish however, the Parish needs to begin thinking about what they would like to have done with the \$159,000 (coastal restoration, workforce development and job creation, state parks, coastal flood projection, etc.). A brief discussion was held regarding projects (Bayou Beouf Erosion Project, Lake Verret and Attakapas Project, Pierre Part Bay Bulkhead, etc.) that will meet the criteria. Following the discussion, the Grants Coordinator just stated that this information was given so the Parish can begin preparing.
4. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized Ed Stock with C. J. Savoie's Office, who recommended approval for substantial completion for the Critical Fire Hydrant Project.
5. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Martin Triche, "THAT, the committee approve and grant substantial completion on the Critical Fire Hydrant Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
6. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the OEP Director, who stated that a variance for an undersized lot in the Retreat is being requested. He stated that the lot is 7,500 ft. and the owner will only use the lot for parking and storage purposes not for residential. He also stated that this restriction has been stipulated on the plat presented. In response, he stated that there will be no utilities on the property.
A constituent in the area stated that the committee needs to consider those property owners that are building expensive homes in and around that area.
Following a brief discussion regarding the location and the actual use, the committee agreed to grant the variance.
7. Committee member Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee approve and grant a variance for an undersized lot at 179 Rebecca Lane in the Retreat for a parking lot subject to the restriction being stipulated on the plat." The motion was unanimously adopted.

8. Committee member Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, 'THAT, the committee approve a 10 ft. variance on front setback at 112 Avenue B.' The motion was unanimously adopted.
9. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized Ed Stock with C. J. Savoie's Office, who stated that at the last meeting an extension was granted until December 4, 2015 for the contractor with the low bid for the Sportsman Drive Concrete Road Repairs and Scott Drive Concrete Repairs to submit the appropriate documents. He then stated that as of today, the information has not been received. Therefore, he asked how to proceed with further extension or rescind and rebid.
10. Committee member Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee approve to rescind the bid received for the Sportsman Drive Concrete Road Repairs and Scott Drive Concrete Repairs Projects." The motion was unanimously adopted.
11. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the OEP Director, who proceeded with the following update on all Disaster Recovery Grants:
 - Cancienne Canal Project – No updates at this time.
 - Bertrandville Sewer Project –They continue to install the service laterals to the parish servitudes, the contractor is still making house connections, and they have installed the fence around the treatment plant. The man hole should be complete by next week.
 - Peterville Sewer Project – Ed Stock with C.J. Savoie's Office stated that the lift station and the 1st man hole have been installed.
 - Marais Sewer Project – The application has been submitted and the survey has been completed by South Central Planning. Waiting on State approval.
 - Sewer Generators Project – Reviewing the project for redesign to fit the budget. Will bid out shortly.
 - Pump Station Project – The Parish Engineer stated that the advertisement is in the official journal and the bids will be received on January 20, 2016.
 - The Safe Room for the Road & Bridge Department – Approval has been granted and still waiting on the hard copy. He stated that he spoke with a representative of Duplantis Design Group and will meet before the end of the year to review the plans. The project will bid out at the beginning of the year.
 - Hazardous Mitigation Plan –The Plan comments are coming in and responses are being given. He stated that the deadline is April 2016.
 - Linear Park Project – The Parish Engineer stated that the project has been submitted.
 - EPA Wastewater Project – This project will be with the Sewer Generator Project and the disaster recovery.
 - Belle Rose Library – The mechanical and electrical engineers are still working on their designs. The project should bid out shortly after the beginning of the year.
12. The OEP Director stated that there are no updates on the FEMA appeal.
13. The OEP Director stated that he went out to the Sinkhole and tagged bottom. He stated that it measured at 185 ft. at its deepest point. He stated that they continue to vent gas in the Sportsman Drive area. The seismic activity is up and down on a daily basis. There was a community meeting with the local residents at the site and a power point presentation was given and questions were answered. He further stated that Texas Brine continues to use the sinkhole water to produce brine which is bringing the water level down.
14. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, 'THAT, there being no further business to come before the Engineering/Grants Committee, the meeting be adjourned.' The motion was unanimously adopted

Public Hearing (Proposed amendment to the Noise Ordinance)

1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Martin Triche, Chairman; Mr. Patrick Lawless, Mr. Jeff Naquin, Mr. Irving Comeaux, Mr. Calvin James, Mr. Henry Dupre, Mr. Booster Breaux, Mr. Myron Matherne.
Committee member recorded as absent was: Mr. Patrick Johnson.
2. Chairman Martin Triche stated that there have been several discussions regarding a proposed amendment to the noise ordinance. He stated that a draft was adopted at the last meeting and the sound level readings in decibels were left blank for further discussion. A summary of the decibel readings from the surrounding parishes has been provided by the Secretary-Treasurer. He further stated that due to recommendations, it is vital that the Parish have some objective measure of the reading so that someone can be deemed in violation when the law enforcement is faced with this situation. He then opened the meeting to public comments, questions, or concerns. He recognized Leroy Blanchard, who stated that there is a high pitch sound that comes from an industrial site near his resident. He stated that although the decibel level may be a little low, the pitch can still be classified as a nuisance. He then stated that in the definition section there was mentioned pure tone and there is a different decibel level for different frequencies. He added that at lower frequencies the decibel level can be high but as the frequency increases the same loudness drops on the decibel meter. He further stated that there is no enforcement for the pure tone and how it applies to noise. Mr. Blanchard then stated that the discharge of fire arms in residential area is included but there is no definition for residential area. He further explained that he has nuisance (wild animals) in his yard and would like to shot them at night which is legal in LA in certain months.
Chairman Martin Triche recognized Herbert LeBlanc, 654 Michel Rd., who stated that he lives on the river and on the weekend the boats pass by with open exhaust for hours. Therefore, he would like to know if something to control this will be included in the ordinance and what will be the decibel level.
3. Following three (3) calls, there were no further comments received. Therefore, the public hearing was closed.
4. Committee member Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, 'THAT, there being no further business to come before the Assumption Parish Police Jury, the meeting be adjourned.' The motion was unanimously adopted.

Public Hearing (Proposed permanent "No Wake Zone" for the Bayou Pierre Part vicinity to included 500 ft. South of Hwy 70 and 3,500 ft. North of Hwy 70)

1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Martin Triche, Chairman; Mr. Patrick Lawless, Mr. Jeff Naquin, Mr. Irving Comeaux, Mr. Calvin James, Mr. Henry Dupre, Mr. Booster Breaux, Mr. Myron Matherne.
Committee member recorded as absent was: Mr. Patrick Johnson.
2. Chairman Martin Triche stated that the purpose of the public hearing is to receive comments, questions, or concerns regarding the proposed permanent 'No Wake Zone' for the Bayou Pierre Part vicinity. He then opened the meeting to the public and recognized Mr. Mody Rivers, Rue De Kajun, who clarified the location and stated that the kids often play in this area defined but some of the boats come through there under the bridge wide open which can cause a serious tragedy. He then stated that there is an erosion problem and they don't slow down when the water is high and it's washing out the bank and the bulkheads. He also stated that bouys were installed but the kids attempted to remove them until the Sheriff's Office came out to stop them. Mr. Rivers also told of an incident that involved a boat landing in a person's yard, a sinking of a boat trespassing on other property, etc. He further explained that the goings on in the area happen because they are aware that the game warden or any enforcement agency will not come out to reprimand them. He stated that he is in favor of the 'No Wake Zone' and understands it's an inconvenience.
3. Chairman Martin Triche recognized Paul Hebert who stated that he is definitely opposed to any permanent 'No Wake Zone' anywhere in Assumption Parish. He then stated that he respects those that are in favor but he can't agree with them. He stated that before consideration to pass a law the advice of an expert should be sought. He then stated that in this case he would be that person because he has lived along the bayou all his life. He stated that he has boat traffic in front of his home daily and he has never considered asking them to slow down because those are natural waterways that were given to everyone in the country. There are laws to protect all the concerns mentioned but they are not being enforced. He stated that the people that live on the water front or the bayou banks, it was their choice to live there so they don't have the right to stop the recreation that goes on in the bayous. He further stated that the Wildlife and Fishery agent informed him that if there is a permanent 'No Wake Zone' there will be less enforcement. He stated that the agent said he will not idol 5 ½ miles to enforce it. Mr. Hebert stated that the problems that were mentioned can be enforced by our Sheriff's Office but it's not being done. He further stated that he is totally against the permanent 'No Wake Zone' but if the parish considers passing this ordinance, he would like the opportunity to bring residents that oppose this law.
4. President Martin Triche recognized Brenda Rivers, who stated that the elders of Pierre Part lived to save the area. She stated that the people are showing no respect and the Jury is choosing to use a sign that people can read and don't obey. She then expressed the danger that is posed and those elders that can't enjoy their property on the bayou. Mrs. Rivers further stated that she respects the other opinions but to prohibit another death, this ordinance is necessary.
5. Mr. Hebert stated that the hydro sliding, tubing, speeding, etc. is considered wreckless operation and there are laws on the books to govern that. Therefore, if the Sheriff's Office would have been notified, those individuals would have been ticketed. He added that if there are no homes near the bayou there will not be any erosion problems but when the people decide to take away what nature has in place, erosion occurs. Mr. Hebert then stated that there is a law in place to idle when the water is high however, if there are people speeding during this time, the Sheriff's Office should be doing their job by enforcing the laws. He further stated that if the water is not high he will not idle.
5. Following three (3) calls, there were no further comments received. Therefore, the public hearing was closed.
6. Committee member Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, 'THAT, there being no further business to come before the Assumption Parish Police Jury, the meeting be adjourned.' The motion was unanimously adopted.

1. The Regular Meeting of the Assumption Parish Police Jury was called to order by Police Jury President Martin S. Triche in the Assumption Parish Police Jury Chamber, located at 4813 Highway 1, Napoleonville, Louisiana.
2. Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Jeff Naquin, Ward 2; Mr. Patrick Lawless, Ward 1; Mr. Irving Comeaux, Ward 3; Mr. Martin Triche, Ward 5; Mr. Calvin James, Ward 6; Mr. Henry Dupre, Ward 7; Mr. Booster Breaux, Ward 8; Mr. Myron Matherne, Ward 9, Police Juror recorded as absent was: Mr. Patrick Johnson, Ward 4.
3. President Martin Triche led the Prayer and Police Juror Calvin James led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.
4. Police Juror Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Henry Dupre, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the minutes of November 25, 2015 meeting." The motion was unanimously adopted.
5. President Martin Triche opened the meeting to the public for any public comments, questions or concerns regarding the matters listed on the agenda. President Martin Triche recognized Mr. Calvin Hebert, 3631 Keith St., Pierre Part, who presented a petition signed by over 1,000 people that are against placing the spoils in Point A' Joe area. President Martin Triche recognized Raymond Blanchard, 138 Redwood St., Labadieville, who stated that for information only, the committee discussed the water flow at Lower Texas Bridge, but he did a dry hydrant inspection and there is drainage and the bridge flow is flat with 8" holes on both sides for drainage into the bayou. President Martin Triche recognized Milton Daigle, 239 Michel Rd., who asked if the 22 pumps in the hazardous pump project are for drainage districts or can be placed anywhere. In response, the OEP Director stated that it's a combination of both, volunteer drainage districts as well as some of the authorized areas. Mr. Daigle then stated that under the Lake Verret Project will it be 8" dredging for the entire 7 miles or what is the exact scope of the project. In response, Police Juror Henry Dupre stated that they will try and get it to 8 ft. all the way across. He further stated that the Jury is redirecting the plans to move forward with the project. A brief discussion was then held regarding the hazardous mitigation pump project and the timing of the project. Following three (3) calls, there were no comments received.
6. President Martin Triche recognized Drainage Committee Chairman Henry Dupre, who stated that the committee met and recommended the following matters; \$1,000 for Royal & Sharp St. Catchbasins Project, \$800 for Ann St. Culvert Replacement Project from project #91132, resolution to DOTD requesting that they reverse the flow of water at the Lower Texas Bridge, \$18,000 for the Lower Texas Drainage System Project, \$500 for 137 Derrick St. Catchbasin Project, and \$500 for 130 Greenleaf Blvd Catchbasin Project utilizing a reallocation from project #91132.
7. Police Juror Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Drainage Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted.
8. Police Henry Dupre stated that the committee discussed the Lee Drive Bulkhead which is also Bayou Pierre Part North Drainage District Project and the low bid of \$44,466.12 that was received. He then stated that \$3,300 for Culvert Installation and Catchbasin will also be needed. He further stated that there is \$21,881 budgeted for the project however, he is requesting \$12,769 from the drainage fund allocation.
9. Police Juror Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, "THAT, the Police Jury approve \$3,300 for Bayou Pierre Part North Drainage District Culvert Installation and Catchbasin Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
10. Police Juror Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, "THAT, the Police Jury approve a \$12,769 allocation for the Bayou Pierre Part North Drainage District Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
11. President Martin Triche stated that the Finance Committee met and recommended the following matters; payment of the bills submitted through December 4, 2015 and the quarterly allocation to the Chamber of Commerce.
12. Police Juror Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Finance Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached)

13. President Martin Triche recognized Engineering/Grants Committee Chairman Irving Comeaux, who stated that the committee met and recommended the following matters; had an in depth discussion on the options relative to the CIAP Lake Verret Project, received an update on the RESTORE Act and discussed potential projects, substantial completion on the Critical Fire Hydrant Project, granted a variance to approve an undersized lot in the Retreat for a parking lot subject to the restriction being stipulated on the plat, 10 ft. variance on front setback at 112 Avenue B, rescind the bids received for Sportsman Drive Concrete Rd Repairs and Scott Drive Concrete Repairs, update on the Disaster Recovery Grants, FEMA appeals, and the Bayou Corne Situation.
14. Police Juror Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, 'THAT, the Police Jury approve the Engineering/Grants Committee report as presented.' The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolutions attached)
15. President Martin Triche stated that a public hearing was held to receive comments, questions, or concerns regarding the proposed amendment to the Noise Ordinance. He stated that comments were received from Mr. Leroy Blanchard relative to consideration of pure tone and discharge of fire arms in residential area to be included and Mr. Hebert LeBlanc relative to including motorized vessels.
A brief discussion was then held regarding further actions. Following the discussion, further clarification was requested regarding the comments that were received.
16. President Martin Triche stated that a public hearing was held to receive comments, questions, or concerns regarding the proposed permanent "No Wake Zone" for the Bayou Pierre Part vicinity to include 500 ft. South of Hwy 70 and 3,500 fr. North of Hwy 70. He stated that comments were received from Mr. Mody Rivers and Mrs. Brenda Rivers who are in favor of the 'No Wake Zone' and Mr. Paul Hebert who is not in favor of the 'No Wake Zone'. He then recognized Police Juror Booster Breaux who stated that he is familiar with the area and agrees with the Rivers concerns but also has respect for Mr. Hebert's view. He then stated that there is an enforcement problem and he is not sure if a permanent 'No Wake Zone' is going to eliminate what is taking place in those areas. He further stated that it may be necessary to visit with more people in the area because there are no other permanent 'No Wake Zones'.
Police Juror Henry Dupre stated that he understands Juror Breaux's thoughts but if a permanent 'No Wake Zone' is placed, the question of when should it be enforced is removed. This would also enforce the laws that are already in place and enhance the safety of everyone. He then stated that it's a big step but he is willing to pass the law because the concerns he is receiving it would be for the safety of the people in the area as well as the young children.
President Martin Triche stated that he agrees but these zones are done to protect people's property and the shoreline but when its permanent everyone that lives on the bayou anywhere can make the same argument regarding children, wreckless operation, etc. therefore, the matter works both ways.
17. Police Juror Henry Dupre offered a motion, "THAT, the Police Jury approve a permanent 'No Wake Zone' for the Bayou Pierre Part vicinity to include 500 ft. South of Hwy 70 and 3,500 ft. North of Hwy 70." The President declared the motion failed due to the lack of a second.
18. President Martin Triche recognized Consuella Skidmore, Registrar, who stated that the Police Jury requested an update on the multiple locations for early voting as well as the time change for elections. She stated that there can be multiple polling locations for early voting but the Parish would be responsible for bearing the entire cost (computers, facilities, workers, etc.). She also stated that the State Legislature changed the voting hours for elections. In response, she stated that she could not say what the cost would be. President Martin Triche thanked the Registrar for addressing the matter.
19. Police Juror Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Calvin James, 'THAT, the Police Jury approve a Can Shake for the American Legion Post 585 (12/12/15).' The motion was unanimously adopted.
20. President Martin Triche announced that the final Police Jury meeting will be held on Wednesday, December 16, 2015 due to budgeting requirements.
21. Police Juror Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, there being no further business to come before the Assumption Parish Police Jury, the meeting be adjourned." The motion was unanimously adopted.
