1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Henry Dupre, Chairman; Mr. Myron Matherne, Mr. Irving Comeaux, Mr. Calvin James, Mr. Booster Breaux.  
Committee member recorded as absent was: Mr. Martin Triche.  
Other Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Patrick Lawless, Mr. Jeff Naquin.
2. Committee member Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the committee approve \$4,920 for 422 Cherry St. Drainage Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
3. Committee member Martin Triche entered the meeting at this time.
4. Committee member Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the committee approve \$4,720 for 431 Cherry St. Drainage Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
5. Committee member Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the committee approve \$1,200 for Bayou L'Ourse Boat Launch Culvert Installation Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
6. Chairman Henry Dupre recognized committee member Martin Triche, who explained the potential diversion project for the Brusly St. Vincent area and stated that a surveyor would be needed. He requested an allocation of \$5,000 to get this process started.
7. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Calvin James, "THAT, the committee approve \$5,000 and authorize the Parish Engineer to hire a surveyor to perform survey work in the Brusly St. Vincent area." The motion was unanimously adopted.
8. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, "THAT, the committee approve \$1,900 for the Star Center Culvert Installation Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
9. Committee member Calvin James offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the committee approve \$850 for 5401 Hwy 1 Culvert Replacement Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
10. Committee member Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, "THAT, the committee approve \$1,500 for 148 N Bay Rd. Pump Replacement Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.

1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Martin Triche, Chairman, Mr. Patrick Lawless, Mr. Jeff Naquin, Mr. Henry Dupre, Mr. Booster Breaux.  
Other Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Irving Comeaux, Mr. Calvin James, Mr. Myron Matherne.
2. Committee member Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee approve to pay the bills submitted through March 20, 2015." The motion was unanimously adopted.
3. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, "THAT, the committee approve supplemental pay for ADA Philip Maples." The motion was unanimously adopted.
4. Committee member Patrick Lawless offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the committee approve and accept the low bid of \$47,825 submitted by LA Contractors, LLC for the Critical Fire Hydrant Installation, 2014-2015 LGAP Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
5. Chairman Martin Triche recognized the Secretary-Treasurer, who stated that she received and reviewed the paperwork regarding the Bertrandville Sewer Plant Property Clearing Project and forwarded a copy to the ADA. In reply, ADA Michael Calabro informed the committee that pursuant to the contract, the Parish agreed to clear off the entire piece of property in lieu of the donation of property therefore, the Parish can accept the low bid and move forward.  
The Secretary-Treasurer then stated that P&T Turtle Farm submitted the low bid of \$8,500 and she would be contacting SCPDC to see if reimbursement of the cost is within the grant funding.
6. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, "THAT, the committee approve and accept the low bid of \$8,500 from P&T Turtle Farm for the Bertrandville Sewer Plant Property Clearing Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
7. Chairman Martin Triche recognized the Parish Manager, who requested authorization to piggy back with East Feliciana Parish bid to purchase a road grader. He stated that the cost is \$182,282 and the funds are within the budget.
8. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, "THAT, the committee approve and authorize the Parish Manager to piggy back with East Feliciana Parish bid to purchase a Road Grader in the amount of \$182,282." The motion was unanimously adopted.
9. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, "THAT, there being no further business to come before the Finance Committee, the meeting be adjourned." The motion was unanimously adopted.

Engineering/Grants Committee Meeting  
Of the  
Assumption Parish Police Jury

Wednesday, March 25, 2015  
5:15 O'clock p.m.

1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Irving Comeaux, Chairman; Mr. Henry Dupre, Mr. Patrick Lawless, Mr. Jeff Naquin, Mr. Martin Triche.  
Other Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Patrick Johnson, Mr. Calvin James, Mr. Booster Breaux, Mr. Myron Matherne.
2. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the Secretary-Treasurer, who informed the committee that the projects, the Water Line and the Replenish of Fish, submitted at the last meeting to the Grants Coordinator were not viable projects for the Restore Act Funding Grant. In response, she stated that the project has to be geared around Coastal Restoration and advised that the Jury discuss the matter further and consider submitting a project ASAP.  
Chairman Irving Comeaux explained the erosion problem on the Bayou Beouf Rd. and stated that they previously placed rift raft to prevent further erosion but more is needed.  
Following a brief discussion, the committee agreed to submit the Bayou Beouf Rd. Erosion Project for the Restore Act Funding.
3. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee approve submitting the Bayou Beouf Rd. Erosion Project for the Restore Act Funding Application." The motion was unanimously adopted.
4. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized committee member Patrick Lawless, who suggested that College Point Lane Sewer Treatment Plant Project be submitted for the FY15 LCDBG Funding. He then requested that the Jury approve scheduling a public hearing to get public views.  
Following a brief discussion, Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized Martha Cazaubon of South Central Planning, who explained the process for submitting a LCDBG Project and stated that scheduling a public hearing is the first step.  
The committee agreed to submit the College Point Lane Sewer Plant and schedule a public hearing in 30 days.
5. Committee member Patrick Lawless offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee approve College Point Lane Sewer Treatment Plant for the FY15 LCDBG Funding and schedule a public hearing in 30 days." The motion was unanimously adopted.
6. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the Parish Engineer, who stated that he has received all the clearances for Lower Texas Boat Launch, including the description of property, etc. and the lease agreement has been signed. He is currently proposing a layout and when completed and approved by Mr. Johnson, he will need the Jury's approval before going out to bid for three (3) quotes.
7. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized committee member Martin Triche, who stated approval was given to replace/relocate the culvert in Brusly St. Vincent near the span bridge. He then stated that \$5,000 was approved for survey work on Hwy 403 to divert the water before it reaches the Brusly St. Vincent area. He then stated that about 25% of the area will need a Corp of Engineer permit therefore, he would suggest that the Engineer get started with the application. In response, the Parish Engineer recommended that an application is done for the Corp of Engineer as well as DNR and set up preemptive meetings with both agencies.
8. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, "THAT, the committee approve and authorize the Parish Engineer to begin the permit application to the Corp of Engineer and DNR for the Brusly St. Vincent Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
9. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized Mr. Jimmy Westerfield, who informed the committee that he would be using hardy plank for the skirting material around the mobile homes at 5588 Hwy 1. Police Juror Calvin James informed Mr. Westerfield of the numerous complaints he has been receiving regarding the condition of the mobile homes and asked if the units passed the wind zone inspection.  
A brief discussion was then held regarding the proper installation of the hardy plank and the passing of an inspection. The committee also questioned the aggregate that is placed in the driveway and requested that approved material be used before final approval is granted.  
In response, Mr. Westerfield informed the committee that the mobile homes are in very good condition and that he plans to perform some additional work to them. He further stated that everyone is not able to purchase a new mobile home therefore, he is providing a home for those that are less fortunate. He added that he would reside in the units that he provides.
10. Committee member Patrick Lawless offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Henry Dupre, "THAT, the committee approve the use of hardy plank as skirting material for the mobile homes at 5588 Hwy 1 subject to proper installation and inspection." The motion was unanimously adopted.

11. The OEP Director informed the committee that the trailer park ordinance doesn't include the actual trailers but requires proper aggregate, etc. He then explained that the trailers get permitted separately and requires proper skirting, etc. Following a brief discussion regarding the condition of mobile homes and the building code ordinance, the committee authorized the Special Assistant to the OEP Director to get information from the surrounding parishes regarding condition, wind zone requirements, etc.
12. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized committee member Martin Triche, who stated that the Jury previously approved the location of a mobile home on Hwy 402 subject to there being a 100 ft. wood buffer between each structure and maintain their personal sewer system. Mr. Rivere also agreed to require the tenant to place a street light.  
Mr. Eneaux Rivere explained that the 100 ft. buffer will still apply to the additional trailers he is requesting to place on the property. Following a brief discussion, the committee suggested that he also place street lights in the area.
13. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee approve the two (2) additional mobile homes along Hwy 402 subject to there being a 100 ft. wood buffer between each unit and require a street light." The motion was unanimously adopted.
14. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the OEP Director, who stated that the following is an update on all Disaster Recovery Grants:
  - Cancienne Canal Project – The ERR has been submitted and the project is moving forward. The project may begin at the end of summer.
  - Bertrandville Sewer Project –The questions are about the ERR and whether it needs to be updated. South Central Planning has been responding to the e-mails and providing the information to the State agencies.
  - Peterville Sewer Project – ADA Michael Calabro stated that they are still trying to resolve the bond forfeiture issue with the DA's office. Martha Cazaubon stated that the matter is in the court system and takes about two weeks for clearance.
  - Marais Sewer Project – The amendment to the application has been completed and submitted. Martha Cazaubon stated that she is trying to get an update on the review process and stated that an updated ERR will be needed.
  - Ewell/Virginia St. 6" Waterline Project/Belle Rose Lane Project – Belle Rose Lane Project is scheduled to begin in a week or so and the Ewell/Virginia St. Project should begin at the end of April or the beginning of May, 2015.
  - Belle River Waterline – The release of funds have been sent, the ERR will be finalized soon granting permission to go out for bid. He then stated that the public notice ended on the 24<sup>th</sup> of March.
  - Critical Infrastructure Generators – The generators have been received and they are working with the contractors to lay out a time frame of installation of each one.
  - Sewer Generators Project – Awaiting the completion of a few other projects to determine the funding amount.
  - Bayou L'Ourse Boat Launch Project – The Parish Engineer stated that the project started last week and should take approximately three (3) months to completion providing good weather.
  - Pump Station Project – H&H study has been forwarded to FEMA.
  - The Safe Room for the Road & Bridge Department – Nothing received on the additional funding that's been requested.
  - CIAP Project – The Parish Engineer stated that a draft permit was received and he has no objections. He stated that they are still waiting on finalized documents.
  - Linear Park Project – The Parish Engineer stated that they are in the process of redesigning a portion of the project but they are having an issue with part of the design falling in the right of way of Entergy and Bell South. He then stated that they hope to have a finalized design and an estimate at the next meeting
  - Wastewater Generator Project – The Parish Engineer are making the changes in the language as requested by EPA.
  - Belle Rose Library – The ADA stated that they are making progress with the project. He stated that they are getting drafts of the survey and information from DEQ based upon the time line. He stated that the seller's information is in order and by the next meeting he will have what is needed to move forward.

15. The OEP Director stated that he received the maps back from Mr. Hubbard and submitted them to FEMA contractors. He stated that he received an e-mail from Mr. Hubbard stating that he has more re-mapping to do and will have the corrected maps next week for re-submittal. The OEP Director explained what needed re-mapping.
16. The OEP Director then stated that there has been a lot of seismic activity (code 3) in the sink hole area especially to the south. Texas Brine has submitted some memos indicating that the seismic activity that has been seen is related to or similar to land-slides located in the cap rock area. He then stated that there are additional trees on the east side that are leaning. The gas venting is continuing to produce about 12,000 cubic ft. a day and there are still approximately 9-10 wells producing. He further stated that in the operational meeting today, they indicated that they will be re-developing some of the wells on Sportsman Dr. to get production up.
17. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Martin Triche, "THAT, there being no further business to come before the Engineering/Grants Committee, the meeting be adjourned." The motion was unanimously adopted.

1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Martin Triche, Chairman; Mr. Patrick Lawless, Mr. Jeff Naquin, Mr. Irving Comeaux, Mr. Patrick Johnson, Mr. Calvin James, Mr. Henry Dupre, Mr. Booster Breaux, Mr. Myron Matherne.
2. Chairman Martin Triche stated that the purpose of the public hearing was to hear comments, questions or concerns regarding the proposed establishment for Redbird's Nest, LLC Sports Bar. He opened the meeting to the public. He recognized Mr. Bobby Clark, 2996 Hwy 1, who stated that he resides next door and has complained about the present noise that comes from the activity outside the store. He stated that he calls the Sheriff's Office every week because of the loud music, noise and crowd that happens next door to him. He also stated that there was a shooting that took place there. He further stated that he has a petition signed by the neighbors that is against the sports bar coming to the area. In response, he stated that he is not in favor of the establishment opening next door to him.  
Chairman Martin Triche recognized Raymond Blanchard, 138 Redwood St., Labadieville, who stated that he doesn't reside in the area but because of a problem with a previous bar, he suggested that the Police Jury install a decibel meter at the location and set it to operate at a certain time so the Parish would not have to rely on here say. He then voiced his concern regarding the school that is located in the vicinity and is it located in the appropriate distance.
3. Following three (3) calls, there were no further comments received. Therefore, he requested that the public hearing be closed.
4. Committee member Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, there being no further business to come before the Assumption Parish Police Jury, the meeting be adjourned." The motion was unanimously adopted.

1. The Regular Meeting of the Assumption Parish Police Jury was called to order by Police Jury President Martin Triche in the Assumption Parish Police Jury Chamber located at 4813 Highway 1, Napoleonville, Louisiana.
2. Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Patrick Lawless, Ward 1; Mr. Jeff Naquin, Ward 2; Mr. Irving Comeaux, Ward 3; Mr. Patrick Johnson, Ward 4; Mr. Martin Triche, Ward 5; Mr. Calvin James, Ward 6; Mr. Henry Dupre, Ward 7; Mr. Booster Breaux, Ward 8; Mr. Myron Matherne, Ward 9.
3. President Martin Triche led the Prayer and Police Juror Calvin James led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.
4. Police Juror Calvin James offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the minutes of the March 11, 2015 meeting." The motion was unanimously adopted.
5. President Martin Triche opened the meeting to the public for any public comments, questions or concerns regarding the items listed on the agenda. He recognized Clyde Hebert, 5577 Hwy 1, who stated that the Westerfield trailer park will be fulfilled according to the requirements but there will be no further maintenance after approval. He stated that it will become run down and dirty and be an eye sore to the parish.  
The OEP Director stated that the Parish has regulatory authority over the fencing and skirting but nothing over the manufactured home. In response, he stated that the manufactured commission would have to be contacted to get regulatory information. He also stated that he will contact the office to see if a representative can attend the next meeting.  
A brief discussion was then held regarding the condition of the mobile homes throughout the parish.  
Following three (3) calls, there were no comments received.
6. President Martin Triche recognized Drainage Committee Chairman Henry Dupre, who stated that the committee met and recommended the following matters; \$4,920 for 422 Cherry St. Drainage Project, \$4,720 for 431 Cherry St. Drainage Project, \$1,200 for the Bayou L'Ourse Boat Launch Culvert Installation Project, \$5,000 and authorize the Parish Engineer to hire a surveyor to perform survey work in the Brusly St. Vincent area, \$1,900 for the Star Center Culvert Installation Project, \$850 for 5401 Hwy 1 Culvert Replacement Project, \$1,500 for 148 N Bay Rd. Pump Replacement Project, and \$3,000 as a cost share for the Landry Subdivision Electrical Float Installation Project.
7. Police Juror Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Drainage Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted.
8. President Martin Triche stated that the Finance Committee met and recommended the following matters: approved to pay the bills submitted through March 20, 2015, supplemental pay for ADA Philip Maples, accepted the low bid of \$47,825 submitted by LA Contractors, LLC for the Critical Fire Hydrant Installation, 2014-2015 LGAP Project, accepted the low bid of \$8,500 from P&T Turtle Farm for the Bertrandville Sewer Plant Property Clearing Project, and authorized the Parish Manager to piggy back with East Feliciana Parish bid to purchase a Road Grader in the amount of \$182, 282.
9. Police Juror Patrick Johnson offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Finance Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolutions attached)
10. President Martin Triche recognized Engineering/Grants Committee Chairman Irving Comeaux, who stated that the committee met and recommended the following matters; submitted the Bayou Beouf Rd. Erosion Project for the Restore Act Funding Application, approved College Point Lane Sewer Treatment Plant for the FY15 LCDBG Funding and schedule a public hearing in 30 days, received an update on the Lower Texas Boat Launch, authorized the Parish Engineer to begin the permit application to the Corp of Engineer and DNR for the Brusly St. Vincent Diversion Project, authorized the use of hardy plank as skirting material for the mobile home park at 5588 Hwy 1 subject to proper installation and inspection by the Permit Officer, must put approved aggregate and paint the trailers, approved the two (2) additional mobile homes along Hwy 402 subject to there being a 100 ft. wood buffer between each unit and require a street lights and individual sewer systems, received an update on the Disaster Recovery Grants, the FEMA appeals and the Bayou Corne situation.

11. Police Juror Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Johnson, 'THAT, the Police Jury approve the Engineering/Grants Committee report as presented.' The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolutions attached)
12. President Martin Triche stated that a Public Hearing was held regarding the proposed establishment for Redbird's Nest LLC Sports Bar. He stated that comments were heard from Mr. Bobby Clark in opposition of the establishment and suggestions/concerns were voiced by Mr. Raymond Blanchard regarding the school being in the vicinity and the installation of a decimal meter.
13. President Martin Triche recognized the Secretary-Treasurer, who stated that the Jury previously authorized the donation of equipment to four (4) fire departments and a piece of equipment for the Bayou L'Ourse Fire Department was overlooked. Therefore, this endeavor is being done to make that donation to be placed on their asset list.
14. Police Juror Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve a Cooperative Endeavor Agreement between the APPJ and the Bayou L'Ourse Fire Department." The motion was unanimously adopted.
15. Police Juror Patrick Lawless offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve a Can Shake permit for Cystic Fibrosis Foundation (4/25/15)." The motion was unanimously adopted.
16. Police Juror Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve adoption of ordinance 15-01 to levy charges for the removal of a derelict structure located at 3610 Hwy 1." The motion was unanimously adopted. (ordinance attached)
17. President Martin Triche requested that a resolution be sent to the Legislative Delegation requesting that they repeal the tax credit that may adversely impact the local levels (Sheriff's Office, School Board, etc.) relative to ad valorem taxes. In response, he stated that it would be about 27% of the assessed value totaling about \$5 million loss to the parish. He proceeded to briefly explained in detail how the local levels can be affected.
18. Police Juror Calvin James offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, 'THAT, the Police Jury approve a resolution requesting that the Legislative Delegation repeal any amendments to the Inventory Tax Laws relative to ad valorem taxes.' The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached)
19. Police Juror Calvin James offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, 'THAT, the Police Jury approve the 1<sup>st</sup> phase of the derelict structure procedure for dwelling located at 117 Bertrand St.' The motion was unanimously adopted.
20. President Martin Triche recognized Police Juror Calvin James, who stated that 123 St. Peter St. derelict has been an ongoing matter for several years. He stated that H&L Improvements acquired the property at a Sheriff's Sale and requested an extension to have the property cleaned and home renovated once clear title was obtained but at present, nothing has been done. In response, the ADA stated that he would send a follow up final notice to H&L Improvements and proceed following the response received.  
President Martin Triche stated that the Principal of the school contacted him regarding the bee problem around the home and stated that the Parish can't go on private property but suggested that the Parish Manager try to assist in getting the problem solved by spraying from the right of way.
21. Police Juror Calvin James offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, 'THAT, the Police Jury approve and authorize the ADA to send a follow up final notice letter to H&L Improvements regarding the structure located at 123 St. Peter St.' The motion was unanimously adopted.
22. Police Juror Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Johnson, "THAT, the Police Jury approve a light at 158 Redwood St." The motion was unanimously adopted.
23. Police Juror Patrick Lawless offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, 'THAT, the Police Jury approve the 1<sup>st</sup> phase of the derelict structure located on the batture in Plattenville, bounded front or east by LA Hwy 308, upper side of property by Clema Kern.' The motion was unanimously adopted.
24. Police Juror Patrick Lawless offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Irving Comeaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the 1<sup>st</sup> phase of the derelict structure located on the batture next to the Dyson's Property." The motion was unanimously adopted.
25. President Martin Triche recognized the Parish Manager, who stated that the installation of speed bumps can be a liability issue.  
Police Juror Patrick Johnson requested an opinion regarding incorporating the bumps into the street and highlighting the areas.



In response, the Parish Engineer stated that speed bumps are not an approved traffic device and the parish could be held liable if a car gets damaged. He also stated that when other parishes install them, they are taking a risk.

Following a brief discussion, the Jury requested that the ADA look further into the matter and grant an opinion on need versus liability.

**Ordinance 15-01**

The Secretary-Treasurer of the Assumption Parish Police Jury is also hereby authorized and directed to file a special assessment against the subject property for the above charges if collection is not made as a result of action authorized in Section 1 above within 60 days. A certified copy of said special assessment shall be filed with the Clerk of Court of Assumption Parish, who shall forthwith record same in the Mortgage Records of said Parish. Such assessment when so filed and recorded shall operate as a lien and privilege against the property herein assessed, which lien and privilege shall rank from the date of filing of the assessment in the Mortgage Records of said Parish and shall prime all other claims, mortgages and liens, except taxes and prior recorded special assessment liens.

Section 3. If an section, clause, paragraph, provision or portion of this ordinance shall be held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not affect any other section, clause, paragraph, provision or portion of this Ordinance, the Police Jury of the Parish of Assumption hereby expressly declaring that it would have passed the remaining portions of this ordinance with the invalid portions omitted.

Section 4. Other ordinance or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 5. This ordinance shall become effective immediately.

Section 6. This ordinance, having been submitted in writing, having been read and adopted by sections at a public meeting of said Police Jury was then submitted to an official vote as a whole, the vote thereon being as follows:
