1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Calvin James, Chairman; Mr. Myron Matherne, Mr. Jeff Naquin, Mr. Henry Dupre, Mr. Booster Breaux, Mr. Martin Triche.
Other Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Patrick Lawless, Mr. Irving Comeaux.
2. Chairman Calvin James recognized the Parish Engineer, who stated that the contractor for the Road Improvement Program has two (2) weeks of work left. He stated that there about 4-5 roads from the original approved list that needs to be completed which brings the total project budget to \$2,181,043.49. He then stated that to date they have expended \$2,034,043.79. He stated that in the last update, the Jury was \$200,000 under budget and the request at the meeting was to utilize \$150,000 of those funds to do parish wide patching. The Parish Engineer explained that some extensive patching was done. He then stated that 76 roads have been completed by either repairs or reconstruction. He stated that there are some punch list items as well as warranty repairs that still need to be completed and is not included in the budgetary items that have been paid to the contractor. He explained that a 5% retainage is being held until all warranty work and punch list items are done satisfactory and the funds will be released. In response, he stated that no substantial completion has been issued. Following a brief discussion, the Parish Engineer stated that there is some additional work that's requested to be done at an estimated cost of \$66,000 bringing the new total budget to \$2,247,043 for an overage of \$147,000. He proceeded to say that there are about 4 asphalt roads to be completed which are located in Ward 5. Once completed, they would be completed with the original list plus the addendums that were added. He further stated that to have completed 76 roads for \$2,247,000 was remarkably well. While there is still work that needs to be done, the Parish took advantage of the very low estimate that was received. The Parish Engineer stated that there has been a few issues with the contractor but they are being addressed. He stated that out of the 76 roads completed, there were problems/issues with 10. In response to Simmons Road Patching Project, he stated that the original budget was over \$40,000 and he's adding to that due to the reassessment that was done and the road failures that were found following the original estimate. He further stated that before a substantial completion is requested he will plan a final site visit to every road and prepare a punch list/warranty list, have a dollar amount attached and retained until satisfactory. He then stated that there are several concrete streets that will be bided out separately since they were not included in the asphalts prices.
3. Committee member Myron Matherne offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee approve and accept the overage of \$147,043.79." The motion was unanimously adopted.
4. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, there being no further business to come before the Road & Bridge Committee, the meeting be adjourned." The motion was unanimously adopted.

Engineering/Grants Committee Meeting

1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Irving Comeaux, Chairman; Mr. Henry Dupre, Mr. Patrick Lawless, Mr. Jeff Naquin, Mr. Martin Triche.
Other Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Calvin James, Mr. Booster Breaux, Mr. Myron Matherne.
2. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee approve change order #1 for the Jail Project totaling \$5,464.81." The motion was unanimously adopted.
3. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the OEP Director, who stated that all of the requirements for Duffy Landry Family Subdivision have been met therefore, he recommends that final approval be granted.
4. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, "THAT, the committee approve and grant final approval for Duffy Landry Family Subdivision." The motion was unanimously adopted.
5. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized Mrs. Beryl Gomez, who stated that there are still some conflicts on both sides and different views but we were assured that time will be given to work out those details. She stated that basically the base flood elevations could not be converted without a special study of the flood waters. She then stated that they were informed that since there is no new study for the map the conversion can't take place and recommends the base elevation of 6 ft. She then stated that the indications she understood were when you bring a map in that will be converted into a new data measurement the conversion has to take place. The impact on the residents in Assumption Parish alarmed the FEMA Representative. A demonstration was given of an elevation certificate that was done and it indicated that someone that elevates at 6 ft. ends up at about 4.5 ft. She then stated that she was informed that people should not be penalized who built at the correct base flood elevation per the map that is effective today. A further explanation was given and she stated that it's important that when a map comes out it doesn't penalize everyone. In response, she explained how the Parish can get involved based on the maps.
Police Juror Myron Matherne stated that the new study may be 2 years away but because the Atchafalaya Levee didn't come in where they expected, the new study might be pushed up. He also stated that they explained to the FEMA Representative the Bayou Chene Project which may have a different affect on the area.
Police Juror Booster Breaux stated that the only issue with Bayou Chene according to the study is that the project would have to be completed before the new study begins.
In response, Mrs. Gomez stated that they need more time to understand everything correctly, and when they do, FEMA needs to perform a study or not put a new map for Assumption Parish and allow the map to remain the same. She then added that this is a really big deal financially for all those involved.
Police Juror Booster Breaux states that the FEMA Representative wants to assist in any way possible but the only thing the Parish can do is to stay close and abreast on what the State is doing.
Mrs. Gomez stated that the Parish doesn't want them to just submit a map that needs approval when there are things that can and should be done.
6. Police Juror Patrick Johnson entered the meeting at this time.
7. A brief discussion was then held regarding the new study and the time span for completion. In response to a home being below sea level but having levee protection, is flood insurance required? The OEP Director stated that it depends if the levee is a certified levee, if it is and the property is below sea level, it can be built.
Police Juror Booster Breaux thanked Mrs. Gomez and the residents that attended the meeting. He also stated that it's a serious issue for the Parish if the changes take place as they would now. He further stated that they would be communicating with FEMA via e-mail or conference call due to budget cuts.
Committee member Martin Triche stated that the appeal process is very technical in nature so he would recommend that when the appointed committee makes a recommendation, the Police Jury would most likely support it.
Mrs. Gomez stated that FEMA should soon have a reply to the letter sent on December 21, 2012. In response, she explained the conversion process and stated that the datum changed at the monument and further explained what this meant.

Police Juror Booster Breaux stated that any actions that need to take place will be submitted to the Jury but at this time nothing is needed.

8. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the OEP Director, who stated that the seismic data collection was completed and they are rigging up to get back into cavern #3. He then stated that they met with DOTD today regarding the kick off meeting to get started with the feasibility study as well as the environment study for the possible alternate route.
9. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, 'THAT, there being no further business to come before the Engineering/Grants Committee, the meeting be adjourned.' The motion was unanimously adopted.

1. The Regular Meeting of the Assumption Parish Police Jury was called to order by Police Jury President Martin Triche in the Assumption Parish Police Jury Chambers located at 4813 Hwy 1, Napoleonville, Louisiana.
2. Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Patrick Lawless, Ward 1; Mr. Jeff Naquin, Ward 2; Mr. Irving Comeaux, Ward 3; Mr. Patrick Johnson, Ward 4; Mr. Martin Triche, Ward 5; Mr. Calvin James, Ward 6; Mr. Henry Dupre, Ward 7; Mr. Booster Breaux, Ward 8; Mr. Myron Matherne, Ward 9.
3. President Martin Triche led the Prayer and Police Juror Calvin James led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.
4. Police Juror Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Johnson, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the minutes of March 13, 2013." The motion was unanimously adopted.
5. President Martin Triche opened the meeting to the public for any public comments, questions or concerns. Following three (3) calls, no further comments were received.
6. President Martin Triche recognized Drainage Committee Vice-Chairman Myron Matherne, who stated that the committee met and recommended the following; \$17,000 for 330,332, & 334 Cherry St. Culvert Replacement Project, \$600 for 302 Assumption St. Catchbasin Project, and \$2,900 for 3813 Keith St. Culvert Replacement Project.
7. Police Juror Myron Matherne offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Johnson, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Drainage Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted.
8. President Martin Triche recognized R & B Committee Chairman Calvin James, who stated that the committee met and recommended the following: received an update on the Road & Bridge Improvement Program from the Parish Engineer and approved an overage of \$147,043.79, and approved sending a letter to the Legislative Delegation requesting that they speed up the process to complete the Hwy 663 Bridge Project.
9. Committee member Calvin James offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Irving Comeaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Road & Bridge Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached)
10. President Martin Triche stated that the Finance Committee met and recommended the following matters; approved to pay bills submitted through March 22, 2013, approved the quarterly report and payment to the Chamber of Commerce, and approved three (3) Advisory Board Members to attend the Annual LACAP Conference in Bayou Rouge.
11. Police Juror Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Johnson, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Finance Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted.
12. President Martin Triche recognized the Engineering/Grants Committee Chairman Irving Comeaux, who stated that the committee met and recommended the following matters; approved the change order #1 for the Jail Project totaling \$5,464.81, granted final approval for Duffy Landry Family Subdivision, received an update on the FEMA appeals and the Bayou Corne situation.
13. Police Juror Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Engineering/Grants Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolutions attached)
14. President Martin Triche stated that a public hearing was held regarding the proposed 3-Way Stop at Oak & Cypress St. in Labadieville and no comments were received.
15. Police Juror Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve and adopted ordinance 13-02 identifying a 3-Way Stop at Oak St. & Cypress St. in Labadieville." The motion was unanimously adopted. (ordinance)

16. Vice-President Henry Dupre recognized Ms. Lisa Shillings, who stated that South Central Louisiana Human Services Authority was created by Act 449 in 2006 to provide developmental disabilities and behavioral health services to the residents of Assumption, Lafourche, St. Charles, St. James, St. John the Baptist, St. Mary and Terrebonne Parishes. She stated that they have a 9 member Board that governs their services and Assumption Parish nominated Mr. Ray Nicholas to the board and he serves as the President. She proceeded to update the Jury on the services provided by their agency and stated that they have assessments and treatment centers in 4 of the parishes they oversee. Ms. Shillings then stated that the Developmental Disabilities Program regional office is in Thibodaux and the staff goes out to do intakes and assessments. She stated that in 2011 they were the 1st organization of their caliber to become nationally accredited. She then stated that because of budgetary constraints, they had to close the satellite center in Assumption Parish and most of the patients chose to go to St. Mary & and some to Lafourche. She added that they see 524 adults and 53 children at the Assessment Center, 1,954 adults and 326 youths at the Treatment Center and 1,022 adults and 418 youth at the Developmental Disabilities Center. She further stated that they have restructured their services to align with the statewide management organization. She also stated that the Governor chose Magellan for the behavioral management services. She then stated that they received some funding from BP and was able to purchase a mobile unit. She further stated that they are fighting to keep the budget that they currently have, which is state general fund. She briefly gave an overview of the budget and in response, to the self generated funds, she stated that it's from the billing of Medicaid or private insurances. She further stated that they are struggling to provide the services they once had and to keep the clients coming to get the treatment. Ms. Shillings stated that they don't stop coming and the clients are getting sicker and sicker. She then spoke about the LA Spirit Program Crisis Counseling Program and stated that they recently hired an individual to run the program. She recognized Ms. Rhiannon Traigle, who stated that Louisiana Spirit has provided services to individuals affected by hurricanes and the BP Oil Spill. The program received funding and will provide services from February through November. She explained that an assessment phase is done and then they proceed to provide the services to those individuals that are in need. The services have been elevated in Assumption Parish and are now targeting the at-risk population such as children and the elderly. She highlighted the additional services that are being offered and stated that they will continue to offer individualized crisis services, etc. to all the parishes. If any part of the parish is identified and needs assistance, please notify their office so they can have an assessment done. In response, Ms. Shillings stated that they are requesting that the Jury assist them with a location for the mobile unit when it's due to be in the community.
17. Vice-President Henry Dupre recognized Mr. Ben Malbrough, Bayou Lafourche Freshwater District, who introduced himself and stated that he became the new Director of the District in January. He proceeded to give an update of phase II of the Bayou Lafourche reintroduction project. He stated that the District selected the engineering firm and contract negotiations are happening now and they hope to sign within the next several weeks. He stated that they will then start their analysis and state where they will dredge next. He stated that he received the letter from the Parish and understands the concerns but can't be certain where the dredging will start. He stated that it's been narrowed down to two (2) areas, to continue where they left off in Belle Rose, heading South or starting in Thibodaux and go North. Mr. Malbrough then stated that they hired T. Baker Smith of Thibodaux, who will begin the design in about a month. He stated that they stressed to the engineering firm to keep the public informed and involved. In response, he stated that they have \$20 million of CIAP funds to spend on the project. A brief discussion was then held regarding the starting location and why it should be in the Belle Rose area. In response, he explained the dye study that began with 2 pumps running and the next analysis will be with 3 pumps operating. He then stated that he met with Union Pacific last week, who held 2 pre-construction meetings and are waiting for bids to be received. He stated that he doesn't anticipate hearing from the Railroad Company for about 3-4 weeks. He then stated that the Freshwater District is having the culverts cleaned out on the east side of the bayou.

Vice President Henry Dupre requested that Mr. Malbrough keep the parish abreast of any information as he receives it.

Mr. Malbrough stated that the Parish will have many opportunities to relay their message to T. Baker Smith. He also stated that he is not aware of any pressure be placed on the dredging starting in Thibodaux. He further stated that the funds have to be expended by 2016 and they are about 9 months behind.
18. Vice-President Henry Dupre recognized Mr. LaQuinton Davis, who stated that he has the appropriate licenses required for his business. He stated that they may have customers that stop by the store with loud music but he has addressed the situation verbally and with signs. In response, he stated that he doesn't allow drinking on the premises and if he notices it happening, he would ask that they either leave the premises or dump it. He stated that he has an occupational license for the store and a State license for alcohol.
19. Police Juror Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, 'THAT, the Police Jury approve the Assumption Parish School Board event at the Assumption Parish Community Center on April 16, 2013.' The motion was unanimously adopted.

20. Police Juror Patrick Lawless offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, 'THAT, the Police Jury approve proclaiming April as Fair Housing Month.'" The motion was unanimously adopted. (proclamation attached)
21. Vice-President Henry Dupre recognized Police Juror Patrick Lawless, who requested that the owner of K-Gen Power System provide more information regarding the business and its location. After a brief discussion, the Jury requested that the owner of LDD Mechanic Shop attend the next meeting to discuss their intention.
22. Police Juror Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, 'THAT, the Police Jury approve an occupational license for Dayton Heating & A/C and Mirror Image Repair Accessories.'" The motion was unanimously adopted.
23. Police Juror Patrick Lawless offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, 'THAT, the Police Jury approve the proposed amendment to the personnel manual relative to cell phone usage.'" The motion was unanimously adopted. (amendment attached)
24. Vice-President Henry Dupre recognized Police Juror Calvin James, who stated that he has been contacted by numerous constituents regarding the quality of the picture with all channels especially with the high definition. He the requested that a representative of Charter Communications be at the next meeting to discuss the problem and offer some sort of resolution.
25. Police Juror Calvin James offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the Police Jury approve a letter to Charter Communications requesting that a representative attend the next Regular Meeting to address concerns of the constituents.'" The motion was unanimously adopted.
26. Vice-President Henry Dupre stated that voluntary drainage district off Hwy 70 in the Aucoin pump area would like to create a drainage district. He stated that he would like to call a public hearing to get the process started. In response, the Secretary-Treasurer stated that the boundaries and property description have to be identified and approved to begin the process. A brief discussion was then held regarding the steps to create a drainage district. Following the discussion, the Parish Engineer will draft the legal boundaries to get the process started.
27. Vice-President Henry Dupre recognized Police Juror Jeff Naquin, who stated that several issues have been discussed regarding sewer service/maintenance by Density in several areas including Ward 2. He stated that someone inspected the system and stated that it's shot beyond repair. Police Juror Irving Comeaux stated that he spoke with Neil Hertenstein, who stated that they are coming up with several options to present to the bankruptcy court and nothing is supposed to transpire until the end of the year. He stated that the Public Service Commission is looking at two (2) different companies to take over and Density is trying to sell it and wants to know if the Parish is interested in purchasing it. A brief discussion was then held regarding what will the Parish do in the meantime and contacting the Public Service Commission. Police Juror Jeff Naquin stated that he spoke with a representative of the Waterworks regarding the funds Density receives monthly and he was told \$18,000 is collected from Assumption Parish. Police Juror Irving Comeaux requested that the Public Service Commission retract that additional fee that they were collecting to repair the system because they are not being repaired.
28. Police Juror Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, 'THAT, the Police Jury send a letter to the Public Service Commission to retract the additional fee that was charged to Assumption Parish residents by Density.'" The motion was unanimously adopted.
29. Police Juror Jeff Naquin stated that the Public Service Commission needs to let the Parish know what will be done if the Parish receives another heavy rain and the sewer backs up in the residents home. Mr. Comeaux stated that he met with the Board of Health regarding Wildwood Sewer System and was not able to get a straight response because neither entity (DEQ, DHH, PSC) knows what the other is doing.
Follow a brief discussion, the Parish Engineer presented a hand out giving a recommendation for Lucky Hit Subdivision Sewer. He stated that the plant and lift station is in complete disrepair. He stated that in speaking with DEQ, DHH, etc. in the event of a heavy rain fall and there is imminent danger to property and or health, the Parish can go in and manually pump down the system to keep the sewer out of the homes and he would recommend that this is done if the Parish is faced with the situation. He then stated that the preliminary survey and engineering design for replacement and or repair is \$800,000 due to their current state. He briefly explained that nothing is really taking place at these plants, they are shot. If the Parish is forced by DEQ, etc. to do something, he stated that the Parish can hire a contractor for about \$25,000 - \$30,000 per site location to set up a temporary treatment center.
A brief discussion was then held regarding what is being done with the fees that are being collected and can the individuals install their own sewer systems.

In response, Police Juror Irving Comeaux stated that when he spoke with a representative from DEQ, they said the residents could not put in private systems.

In response to why residents can't put their own system, the Parish Engineer stated that if the residents disconnect from the main sewer system and try to connect privately, the lots are too small and can cause worse problems than what are existing. He further stated that DEQ has the authority to appoint someone that is capable to take over the systems.

Vice-President Henry Dupre stated that the Parish doesn't have the man power to handle the systems however, if the Parish can retain the funds that are being collected by Density, could we hire someone to pump out the systems if we should get a heavy rain?

Following a brief discussion, the Parish Engineer stated that this needs to be addressed by the District Attorney.

The Police Jury agreed that a letter be sent to DEQ, DHH, and PSC requesting that a representative attend the next regular meeting to address the following; who should be contacted when a heavy rain comes, can the Parish retain the sewer fee currently being collected to contract out the maintenance service, and can the Public Service Commission retract the additional fees that were put into effect for maintenance?.

30. Police Juror Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, "THAT, the following matter be added to the agenda." The motion was unanimously adopted.
31. Vice-President Henry Dupre requested comments, questions, or concerns regarding the request for a liquor license for St. Elizabeth School Fair. Following three (3) calls, no comments were received.
32. Police Juror Calvin James offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve a temporary liquor license for St. Elizabeth School Fair." The motion was unanimously adopted.
33. Vice-President Henry Dupre requested comments, questions, or concerns regarding the request authorization for the President to sign the grant application for the LACAP Project (Mike St./Landry Subdivision Pump Project. Following three (3) calls, no comments were received.
34. Police Juror Myron Matherne offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Calvin James, "THAT, the Police Jury authorize the President to sign the grant application for the LACAP Project (Mike St./Landry Subdivision Pump Project." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached)
35. Police Juror Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, "THAT, there being no further business to come before the Assumption Parish Police Jury, the meeting be adjourned." The motion was unanimously adopted.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Assumption Parish Police Jury, convened in regular session, this 27th day of March, 2013, that:

Section 1

It is hereby designated that the intersections of Oak St. and Cypress St., located in the Labadieville Community, within Ward 2, Parish of Assumption, State of Louisiana, are "3-WAY STOP" intersections.

Section 2

The proper parish personnel are hereby authorized to erect the necessary placement of "3-WAY STOP" signs at the intersections stated in Section 1 of this ordinance.

Section 3

The Sheriff of this Parish and the Louisiana Department of Public Safety are hereby specifically requested to assist in the enforcement of the provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 4

All ordinances or parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
