2. Committee member Myron Matherne offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Martin Triche, "THAT, the committee approve the re-appointment of Bryan McWilliam and Don Guillot as board members of the Oakridge Gravity Drainage District #8 for 2 yr. terms." The motion was unanimously adopted.
3. Committee member Myron Matherne offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Calvin James, "THAT, the committee approve \$800 for 334 Brule Rd. Catchbasin Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
4. Committee member Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Irving Comeaux, "THAT, the committee approve \$4,700 for 327 Cherry St. Drainage Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
5. Committee member Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, "THAT, the committee approve \$1,050 for Hwy 663 Cross Culvert Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.

1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Martin Triche, Chairman; Mr. Patrick Lawless, Mr. Jeff Naquin, Henry Dupre, Mr. Booster Breaux.
Other Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Irving Comeaux, Mr. Calvin James, Mr. Myron Matherne.
2. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the committee approve payment of the bills submitted through May 8, 2015." The motion was unanimously adopted.
3. Chairman Martin Triche stated that the lease with Dorothy Blaine for the Bertrandville Park has expired and needs renewing. He stated that some of the language has been revised and changed including the lease amount. The lease amount is \$1,000 per year for ten (10) years. He stated that the lease was reviewed and approved by the ADA.
4. Committee member Patrick Lawless offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the committee approve the lease with Dorothy Blaine for the Bertrandville Ball Park including the increase amount to \$1,000 per year and authorize the President to sign." The motion was unanimously adopted.
5. Chairman Martin Triche recognized the Parish Manager, who stated that he received only one (1) bid for the Dorseyville Park playground equipment. He stated that Game Time Equipment submitted a bid of \$49,900. He explained that it is an elaborate set and other companies had price quotes of \$54,000 and \$62,000. He then recommended that the bid be accepted. In response, he stated that this price includes complete set up.
6. Committee member Patrick Lawless offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee approve and accept the low bid of \$49,900 submitted by Game Time Equipment for Dorseyville Park playground equipment." The motion was unanimously adopted.
7. Committee member Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, there being no further business to come before the Finance Committee, the meeting be adjourned." The motion was unanimously adopted.

Engineering/Grants Committee Meeting
Of the
Assumption Parish Police Jury

Wednesday, May 13, 2015
5:10 O'clock p.m.

1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Irving Comeaux, Chairman; Mr. Henry Dupre, Mr. Patrick Lawless, Mr. Jeff Naquin, Mr. Martin Triche.
Other Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Calvin James, Mr. Booster Breaux, Mr. Myron Matherne.
2. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized Ms. Martha Cazaubon, South Central Planning, who explained that the Louis Lane sewer project was dismissed from the joint project with the Marais Sewer due to property ownership issues. She proceeded to explain what would be required with running the lines to connect with Georgette St. and stated that the grant deadline and timelines would be very difficult to meet and continued time extensions will not be granted. She further stated that Police Juror Patrick Johnson expressed interest in expropriation of servitude. In response, committee member Martin Triche added that this is a very lengthy process and suggested that the matter be tabled until Juror Johnson arrives.
3. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the Parish Engineer, who stated that he spoke with Mr. Johnson regarding the Lower Texas Boat Launch but would like to table the matter until he arrives.
4. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the Parish Engineer, who stated that he was provided with a drainage plat of the Philomena Place Subdivision giving a proposed elevation for the homes that will face Hwy 1010. He stated that there will be a 7 ½ ft. elevation, 1 ½ ft. above base elevation, with the drainage sloping in the front of the property. He further stated that he has no objection. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized Mr. David Waitz, representative for Philomena Place Subdivision, who stated that the developer has elevated the 7 lots that are along Hwy 1010 and will drain into the roadside ditch. He then stated that the next phase will have the infrastructure, drainage ditches, pond, etc. for the interior portion of the project. In response to concerns by Chairman Irving Comeaux, the OEP Director stated that in the next phase of the project, the developer will be required to do a flood study for it being both in a zone C and A area.
5. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Martin Triche, "THAT, the committee grant preliminary approval for Philomena Place Subdivision located on Hwy 1010 in Labadieville." The motion was unanimously adopted.
6. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the Parish Engineer, who recommended that the Parish move forward with accepting the low bid submitted by Coastal Bridge Construction LLC for the 2015 Road Improvement Program. In response, he stated that the bid is on a unit basis.
7. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, "THAT, the committee approve and accept the low bidder, Coastal Bridge Construction LLC for the 2015 Road Improvement Program." The motion was unanimously adopted.
8. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized ADA Michael Calabro, who stated that the property for the Belle Rose Library is ready to proceed and the purchase is moving forward. He stated that closing plans that were set are moving forward and approval is needed so it can be attached to the cash sale.
Committee member Henry Dupre stated that this project was a long time coming and thanked everyone that worked so hard to make it possible.
9. Committee member Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Martin Triche, "THAT, the committee approve and authorize the purchase of property for the Belle Rose Library and authorize the President to sign all related documents." The motion was unanimously adopted.
10. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the OEP Director, who stated that the following is an update on all Disaster Recovery Grants:
 - Cancienne Canal Project – Waiting on the release of funds, the public notice is completed and the project is getting close to the end.
 - Bertrandville Sewer Project – The temporary servitude has been acquired and the draft for the construction contract is done and in route to the contractor to attach the necessary bonds for review.
 - Peterville Sewer Project – Mrs. Martha Cazaubon is meeting with Mr. Butler on Friday to finalize all the paperwork.
 - Marais Sewer Project – The project has been amended and the project application is being reviewed. The ERR is being updated.

- Belle Rose Ewell/Virginia St. 6" Waterline Project – The Parish Engineer stated that the Belle Rose Project has about 7 working days to complete the construction at which time they go into a testing phase to make sure the line is secure for completion.
 - Belle River Waterline – Advertisement began on May 12, 2015 and bids will be received on June 11, 2015.
 - Critical Infrastructure Generators – The project is almost complete. He stated that they are doing some site work with the different fire departments etc. for final connection and testing.
 - Sewer Generators Project – Awaiting the completion of a few other projects to determine the funding amount.
 - Bayou L'Ourse Boat Launch Project – The launch section has been poured and they're going to begin building the wharfs before moving forward with the remaining work.
 - Pump Station Project – The OEP Director stated that 20 of the 22 pump stations have been approved and the Parish can move forward on the 20. He recognized Tiffany Dorssett and Kim Wyles, GOHSEP representatives, who stated the 20 pump stations have not been officially approved. She stated that they have to receive the approval letter from FEMA then they have to submit the parish a State approval letter and a sub-grantee agreement that has to be signed before the work begins. She added that Peggy ----- is working on the letter as we speak and they will push until it's received.
In response, Police Juror Myron Matherne stated that he spoke with Peggy ---- and she informed him that the Parish can go out for bids for the 20 pump stations. He further stated that he has been in contact with Peggy --- for the last few months and all the delays are pointing to GOHSEP.
A brief discussion was then held regarding the time frame to begin the project. In response, Kim Wyles stated that approval has to be received from FEMA before anything can begin and that letter has not been received. She further assured the committee that the letter should be received in 2-3 weeks.
 - The Safe Room for the Road & Bridge Department – Verbal approval for the additional funding was received but no further update.
 - CIAP Project – The Parish Engineer stated they received word that the public notice for Lake Verrett will be completed on May 18, 2015. He stated that as of today, there have been no findings and assuming the notice comes in without any, they will have a draft prepared.
 - Linear Park Project – No update, the Parish Engineer and the President are still in communication.
11. The OEP Director then stated that there is no updated information on the FEMA appeals as per Mr. Hubbard.
12. The OEP Director stated that Texas Brine has placed a knock tank at the Boat Launch and operating the well with the tank. The OEP Director they have crossed the 39 million cubic feet of gas that has been produced and flared. He then stated that there are still 7-8 wells still producing gas. In response to the well locations, he stated that they are four (4) on Sportsman Dr. and across Bayou Corne and the other three (3) are on the north side of the highway by the gate, the south side by the facility and on the west side of Grand Bayou. In response to the maintenance of the yards, the OEP Director stated that the question would have to be referred to Texas Brine representatives.
13. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, "THAT, there being no further business to come before the Engineering/Grants Committee, the meeting be adjourned." The motion was unanimously adopted.

Community)

1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Martin Triche, Chairman; Mr. Patrick Lawless, Mr. Jeff Naquin, Mr. Irving Comeaux, Mr. Patrick Johnson, Mr. Calvin James, Mr. Henry Dupre, Mr. Booster Breaux, Mr. Myron Matherne.
2. Chairman Martin Triche stated that the public hearing is called to obtain views on the proposed restrictive traffic on Michel Road in the Pierre Part/Belle River Community. He then opened the public hearing to receive comments, questions or concerns regarding. He then recognized Mr. Hebert LeBlanc; 654 Michel Rd., who stated that there are load limit signs along Cajun St. leading to Michel Rd. that are not adhered to and are not being enforced when reported. In response, Chairman Martin Triche stated that the Parish required an individual with a heavy or oversized load to contact the Parish Road & Bridge Department and obtain a permit and a flagman to direct them in and out of the area.
Mrs. Lucille Husband stated that there are pickup trucks that travel Michel Rd. and Cajun St. at such a high rate of speed constantly.
It was also stated that in the curve on Cajun St. there is always a vehicle parked on the roadside causing the large vehicles to stop so the other vehicle can pass. He stated that trucks are forced to run off the road which causes the erosion problem.
Milton Daigle, 239 Michel Rd. expressed concerns as to whether the same ordinance restrictions for Cajun St were going to apply to Michel Rd. He also stated that speeding is a problem as well. He also spoke about the two (2) trees on Cajun St. that would assist in passable traffic.
In response, Chairman Martin Triche stated that the Parish was only taking public comments and views. No regulations are being considered at this time.
Following three (3) calls, there were no further comments received. Therefore, the public hearing was closed.
3. Committee member Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless,, 'THAT, there being no further business to come before the Assumption Parish Police Jury, the meeting be adjourned.' The motion was unanimously adopted.

1. The Regular Meeting of the Assumption Parish Police Jury was called to order by Police Jury President Martin S. Triche in the Assumption Parish Police Jury Chamber, located at 4813 Highway 1, Napoleonville, Louisiana.
2. Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Patrick Lawless, Ward 1; Mr. Jeff Naquin, Ward 2; Mr. Irving Comeaux, Ward 3; Mr. Patrick Johnson, Ward 4; Mr. Martin Triche, Ward 5; Mr. Calvin James, Ward 6; Mr. Henry Dupre, Ward 7; Mr. Booster Breaux, Ward 8; Mr. Myron Matherne, Ward 9,
3. President Martin Triche led the Prayer and Police Juror Calvin James led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.
4. Police Juror Patrick Lawless offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the minutes of April 22, 2015 meeting." The motion was unanimously adopted.
14. President Martin Triche opened the meeting to the public for any public comments, questions or concerns regarding the matters listed on the agenda. He recognized Paul Gilmore, Paincourtville Fire Department, who stated that the dispatch system is experiencing some deficiencies. There have been some serious repercussions that have happened because of the deficiencies and have happened in the past many times. He then stated that they are working with the Sheriff to resolve this matter therefore, he requested that the Parish get informed and involved as a Fire Board and strongly consider rendering the resources and support to the Sheriff to correct the deficiencies. Mr. Gilmore stated that recommendations will be made and he would ask that the Parish carefully listen and consider them.
President Martin Triche then recognized Ms. Audrey Williams, who requested that she reserve her comments until the matter regarding Peterville Lane be discussed.
Following three (3) calls, there were no further comments.
15. President Martin Triche recognized Drainage Committee Chairman Henry Dupre, who stated that the committee met and recommended the following matters: re-appointed Bryan McWilliam and Don Guillot as board members of the Oakridge Gravity Drainage District #8 for 2 yr. terms, \$800 for 334 Brule Rd Catchbasin Project, \$4,700 for 327 Cherry St. Drainage Project, \$1,050 for Hwy 663 Cross Culvert Project, resolution to DOTD requesting cross culvert on Hwy 998 next to railroad track, \$1,000 for 104 Nathan St. Catchbasin Repair Project, \$1,900 for 114 Gary St. Culvert Replacement, \$400 for Walker Lane Drainage Project, and \$1,050 for Estelle St. Drainage Project.
16. Police Juror Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Drainage Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolutions attached)
17. President Martin Triche recognized Police Juror Patrick Johnson, who stated that he was informed of a tree that has fallen in the Lower Texas Canal and would like to have the Parish Manager get quotes to have it removed. He then requested that the R & B Department look into clearing the canal off of Hwy 1012.
18. President Martin Triche stated that the Finance Committee met and recommended the following matters; approved to pay the bills submitted through May 8, 2015, approved lease with Dorothy Blaine for the Bertrandville Ball Park property including the increase to \$1,000 a year and authorize the President to sign, and the low bid of \$49,900 submitted by Game Time Equipment for the Dorseyville Park playground equipment.
19. Police Juror Calvin James offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Finance Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached)
20. President Martin Triche recognized Engineering/Grants Committee Chairman Irving Comeaux, who stated that the committee met and recommended the following matters; granted preliminary approval for Philomena Place Subdivision located on Hwy 1010 in Labadieville, accepted the low bidder, Coastal Bridge Contractors LLC, for the 2015 Road Improvement Program, authorized the purchase of property for the Belle Rose Library and authorize the President to sign all related documents, received an update on the Disaster Recovery Grants, FEMA appeals, and the Bayou Corne situation.
21. Police Juror Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Engineering/Grants Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolutions attached)

22. Police Juror Patrick Johnson stated that he will not be considering the expropriation of servitude for Louis Lane Sewer Project at this time. He then stated that the Lower Texas Boat Launch Project is still underway. He then stated that a culvert was installed to allow easement and access to get in and do the work that needs to be done.
23. President Martin Triche stated that a public hearing was held to receive comments, questions and concerns regarding views on the proposed restrictive traffic on Michel Rd in the Pierre Part/Belle River Community. He stated several individuals expressed various concerns including no parking, speeding, oversized trucks, lack of enforcement, etc. He then stated that there will be no actions at this time.
24. President Martin Triche recognized Desmond Dickerson, who stated that Peterville Lane has drainage problems due to the trash in the ditches and the residents not adhering to the grass and derelict ordinances. Erlyn Dickerson further stated that the people in the community are not maintaining the grass and properties which is also a factor to the drainage problem. She also stated that the Road Department has been very good with checking the drainage but it will continue if the residents don't comply with the ordinance. She further stated that they have been making a lot of improvements on their home and would like to continue raising the property value for tax purposes.
- President Martin Triche recognized Police Juror Calvin James, who stated that he didn't have any comments because he was never notified about the situation.
- In reply, Mrs. Dickerson stated that she contacted Mr. James and spoke with him at length regarding lighting, drainage, etc. She informed the board that the drainage problem begins at the beginning of the street.
- President Martin Triche stated that if informed, the Parish Manager would have the drainage inspected and taken care of. He then stated that there is an ordinance relative to tall grass and derelicts and briefly explained the process that's followed. He also explained the derelict vehicle process.
- The Secretary Treasurer added and explained that a letter is sent to a land owner only once per calendar year.
- Mrs. Dickerson informed the Jury that she and her husband have filed the proper documents and some of the people are chronic offenders which makes this an ongoing problem.
- President Martin Triche recognized Audrey Williams, who stated that she has been affiliated with Peterville for 62 yrs. and has never had community problems. She stated that the complainant has been there only 5 months. She stated that what's she's hearing is a control issue that is being brought before the parish government. She then stated they have always worked together neighborly to get any problem resolved therefore, these concerns should have been discussed among the residents not the Parish Government and for that she's not pleased. She stated that they mentioned a drainage problem but when someone came out to unblock the drainage, these individuals instructed him not to work in their ditch. She further explained that she clears the leaves from the ditch to keep the drainage flowing properly. In addition, she stated that she would love her community to look better but it consists of many poor people that are doing the best they can. Mrs. Williams then stated that she and her family have never had dealings with the law, drugs, etc. but because of this new constituent, the entire community has been targeted in one way or another and she will not allow that to continue.
- Mrs. Rita Nelson, 135 Peterville Lane, stated that she's been a resident of the community for 46 yrs. and has never had problems with people receiving letters for old cars, grass, trash, derelict structures, etc. She expressed that these petty complaints are causing confusion and hardship for some of the residents of the community. She further stated that the community is family oriented and always came together to resolve any issues that arose, why should it stop now. Once verified that the complainant was not a registered voter, she asked how could the parish acknowledge these complaints when this individual is not a tax payer and the residents of Peterville are.
- In response, President Martin Triche stated that some valid points were made and the Jury is aware that everyone does the best they can with what they have. He also stated that the Police Jury verify and evaluate any complaint that is submitted to the office before acting upon the matter.
- Mr. Louis Nelson, 135 Peterville, Lane stated that he has been a resident of the community for 65 yrs. and has never experienced such confusion. He stated that he has tried to speak with Mr. Dickerson but he refused to talk. He further stated that their community comes together when a problem arises.
- President Martin Triche assured the residents that the Parish will assist with the drainage situation.
- Ms. LaQuan Douglas, 125 Peterville Lane, stated that she has lived in the community for 10 yrs. and has two cars but can't drive both. Therefore, why should she have to move the car she chooses not to drive because the neighbor is tired of looking at it. She also stated that her husband used to maintain the Dickerson's property when he worked out of town.
- Melinda Larkins stated that she has been in Peterville for 52 years and has a home there. She stated that she has never received a letter but if a problem arises with her property she would appreciate if they would come to her. She stated that the two (2) trailers mentioned belong to her nephew, who will have the matter taken care of as soon as possible.
25. President Martin Triche recognized Morgan Landry, 129 Mary Ann St., who stated that the street has become very dangerous with people speeding. He stated that there are many kids in the area and drivers are running the 4-way stop sign. He then stated that he has contacted the

Sheriff's Office and they come out and do their best but they can't patrol 24-7. He further stated that speed bumps would certainly help the issue.

Police Juror Myron Matherne stated that he agrees with Mr. Landry and stated that speed bumps are needed throughout the parish. He then informed Mr. Landry that the Parish is looking into getting them installed on the roads but it will be closer to the end of the year when the Road Improvement Program is completed.

President Martin Triche stated that the Parish received an opinion from the Assistant District Attorney and will look further into the matter once the Road Improvement Program is complete and there are remaining funds.

In response, Mr. Landry stated that the residents of the Parish are not interested in waiting until the end of the year. He stated that the Parish doesn't want a tragedy to occur before they consider slowing the traffic down. He asked if he could purchase his own and place them on the street. President Martin Triche stated that when speed bumps are considered, they will be installed throughout the parish.

A brief discussion was then held regarding the safety of children. Following the discussion, President Martin Triche stated that someone speeding would have the responsibility of his actions, not the parish.

Police Juror Irving Comeaux stated that the legal opinion states that the Parish will be liable for accidents reported regarding the speed bumps.

Police Juror Henry Dupre stated that speed bumps will not protect pedestrians. He also stated that many complaints have been made regarding the deplorable road conditions and now that they are being repaired, complaints are being received regarding speeding.

Police Juror Patrick Johnson suggested that the Parish get with the Sheriff's Office to discuss the streets that are experiencing a lot of speeding and what can be done. He further stated that it may not be the solution but it will help until the Parish approves the speed bumps.

26. Police Juror Patrick Lawless offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve proclaiming April 2015 as Child Abuse Prevention Month." The motion was unanimously adopted.
27. Police Juror Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, "THAT, the Police Jury approve a Can Shake permit for Labadieville Lions Club (8/29/15)." The motion was unanimously adopted.
