1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Henry Dupre, Chairman; Mr. Myron Matherne, Mr. Irving Comeaux, Mr. Calvin James.
Committee members recorded as absent were: Mr. Booster Breaux, Mr. Martin Triche.
Other Police Juror recorded as present was: Mr. Jeff Naquin.
2. Committee member Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, "THAT, the committee approve \$100 for the Labadieville Canal Tree Removal Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
3. Committee member Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, "THAT, the committee approve \$4,700 for 158 & 160 Greenleaf Blvd. Culvert Replacement Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
4. Committee member Calvin James offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, "THAT, the committee approve \$3,800 for 604, 711, & 712 Philosopher St. Culvert Replacement Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
5. Committee member Calvin James offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Irving Comeaux, "THAT, the committee approve \$2,900 for 124 Jolimar St. Culvert Replacement Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
6. Committee member Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Calvin James, "THAT, the committee approve \$500 for 6574 Hwy 1 Stump Removal Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
7. Committee member Martin Triche entered the meeting at this time.
8. Chairman Henry Dupre initiated a discussion regarding the request for concrete replacement at 123 Texaco St. He suggested that the project be accepted as a drainage project and if Mr. Breaux decides it should be a R&B work order, it will be rescinded. He then recognized the Parish Foreman, who explained the reason for the concrete replacement project on Texaco St. Following a brief discussion regarding the project, the committee agreed to table the matter until committee member Booster Breaux arrives.
9. Committee member Calvin James offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Irving Comeaux, "THAT, the committee approve tabling the project at 123 Texaco St." The motion was unanimously adopted.
10. Chairman Henry Dupre recognized committee member Myron Matherne, who stated that on both sides of the middle school football field the water doesn't drain and floods the middle of the field. He then stated that he would like to build a swell on the side of the tree line and haul some dirt to level off the ground to prevent the water from stagnating in the center of the field. He then stated that he spoke with Juror Breaux to assist with the project from the recreation funds and he has agreed.
In response, the Parish Engineer stated that a contractor is needed to identify the low areas of the field. He then stated that two (2) culverts and material are needed to slope the field away from the building and get the water to the slough. He then stated that the total estimated cost of the project would be \$9,900. In response, committee member Myron Matherne stated that he had not contacted the School Board but he plans to meet with them to request some assistance and authorization.
Committee member Martin Triche stated that public funds can't be used on private property of the School Board unless they agree to it. He added that he would support the project if the School Board would submit to the Jury a letter stating that the public can utilize the field on weekends when it's not being utilized by the school.
11. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, "THAT, the committee approve \$10,000 from Wards 8 & 9 recreation funds for the Pierre Part Middle School football field subject to the Assumption Parish School Board allowing public use." The motion was unanimously adopted.

12. Committee member Myron Matherne offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Calvin James, "THAT, there being no further business to come before the Drainage Committee, the meeting be adjourned." The motion was unanimously adopted.

Chairman Henry Dupre stated that he and the Secretary-Treasurer had a conference call with Tommy Landry of Gallagher Insurance regarding the search for the best quotes for the renewal of the general liability insurance. He stated that the cost will be more but he is trying to work on reducing the values on some of the buildings in order for the policy cost to be lowered. Engineering/Grants Committee Meeting
Of the
Assumption Parish Police Jury

Wednesday, May 22, 2013
5:20 O'clock p.m.

1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Irving Comeaux, Chairman; Mr. Henry Dupre, Mr. Jeff Naquin, Mr. Martin Triche.
Committee member recorded as absent was: Mr. Patrick Lawless.
Other Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Calvin James, Mr. Myron Matherne.
2. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the Secretary-Treasurer, who stated that there were some minor changes in the draft agreement from the previous meeting and a copy was sent to the ADA and the Sheriff for review. She stated that she and the President had a meeting with a few of the Police Jury staff to work through some concerns regarding maintenance work versus contract work, reimbursement and in house matters. In response, Sheriff Mike Waguespack stated that they are approved to up to 84 beds. He then stated that double bunking will be allowed and when they complete the G block, they will be able to house a few more. He also stated that a few females will be housed in what will be the S Cell. In response to the facility having a high census of Parish inmates as opposed to State inmates, the Sheriff stated that he will keep Parish inmates and send the State inmates elsewhere. He stated that the fees for this year were high due to the increase to house the inmates. He further stated that security in the new facility will be handled accordingly as time goes and other facilities are willing to assist if need be.
Committee member Martin Triche stated that he is concerned about the percentage to the state which is capped at \$25 per day, but what if that cost goes up.
In response, the Sheriff stated that that is the reason for the clause which states consideration for this agreement shall be subject to a per diem increase, rental increase and CPI increase as the market dictates, as may be agreed to by the parties in a written amendment to the agreement.
Committee member Martin Triche suggested that the Cooperative Endeavor Agreement be approved subject to some of the fine details being worked out without altering the agreement, the ADA's approval and authorize the President to sign.
3. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, 'THAT, the committee grant final approval of the Cooperative Endeavor Agreement with the Assumption Parish Sheriff's Office/Juvenile Detention Facility subject to the fine details being worked out in the contract, the DA's approval and authorize the President to sign the necessary documents.' The motion was unanimously adopted.
4. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Martin Triche, 'THAT, the committee approve the Administrative Services Contract Amendment No. 5 for the CDBG-DR Funds.' The motion was unanimously adopted.
5. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the OEP Director, who stated that the Assistant OEP Director met with Mr. Moore regarding the request for preliminary approval for the travel trailer park located at 772 Hwy 398 in Labadieville before Delise Rd. In response to the flooding situation, the OEP Director stated that it's an RV Park with movable units. He also stated that Mr. Moore is requesting a variance on the fencing in the rear of the property due to the wooded area and the 6" waterline. He then stated that this is only a request for preliminary approval so he can proceed to submit plans for construction approval. The OEP Director then mentioned that the showers, restrooms, and laundry mats are not needed if there are no tent slots.
A brief discussion was then held regarding the fencing location and the requirement for showers and restrooms in accordance with the State as well as the definition of a tent. Following a brief discussion, committee member Martin Triche suggested that the committee grant preliminary approval for the Travel Trailer Park at 772 Hwy 398, subject to DHH approval and that all requirements be met with the exception of fencing in the rear/canal side of the property.
A brief discussion was then held regarding DHH's response regarding the shower, restrooms and tent slots. Following the discussion, the committee agreed to table the matter until a reply is received from the DHH.
6. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Henry Dupre, 'THAT, the committee table the Travel Trailer Park at 772 Hwy 398 request until a reply is received from the DHH.' The motion was unanimously adopted.
7. Mr. Moore informed the committee that DHH has informed him that he would be required to have an office, laundry mat, and a his/her bathroom with a shower.
8. Committee member Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Martin Triche, "THAT, the committee rescind to table the Travel Trailer Park at 772 Hwy 398 request until a reply is received

from the DHH and grant preliminary approval for the Travel Trailer Park and grant a variance for the fencing in the rear/canal side of the property.” The motion was unanimously adopted.

9. The OEP Director stated that he received a letter requesting a 10 ft. variance in the rear of 102 King St. He stated that everything is in order and the neighbors don't have a problem with the request.
10. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Henry Dupre, "THAT, the committee approve a variance of 10 ft. in the rear of 102 King St." The motion was unanimously adopted.
11. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion seconded by Mr. Henry Dupre, "THAT, the committee approve an engineering contract with C.J. Savoie Engineering Firm for the Sewer System Emergency Power Generator Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
12. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the Parish Engineer, who stated that the requested pump is located across from Rue De Cajun St. and is on the pump redundancy list to be done. He then stated that the problem is that the redundancy program replaces a natural gas pump next to an existing electric pump. He stated that the existing electric pump is currently being repaired but the deck and plat form surrounding it is rotted away and is a hazard. He then stated that the estimated cost to replace the deck is \$16,000, which would accommodate the current pump and the upcoming hazardous mitigation pump.
13. Committee member Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee approve and authorize the Parish Engineer to bid out the Ward 7 Drainage Pump Station Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
14. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Henry Dupre, "THAT, the committee approve the amendment to the Engineering Contract for a 6" waterline installation at Ewell/Virginia St." The motion was unanimously adopted.
15. Police Juror Patrick Johnson entered the meeting at this time.
16. Committee member Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee approve the amendment for the Engineering Contract for a 8" waterline installation at LA Hwy 998, Belle Rose Lane." The motion was unanimously adopted.
17. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized Mrs. Beryl Gomez, who stated that there is still no updated information from FEMA but there is another meeting scheduled and she hopes to have a recommendation in June.
18. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the OEP Director, who stated that the Governor came to Bayou Corne on Monday and announced to Texas Brine how displeased he is with the buy-outs. He stated that they are now drilling the Geo Phone well. The one into the salt won't be completed until mid June and operational in August. Cavern #3, the failed cavern was logged and tagged at the bottom. There is 96 ft. left to be filled. He then stated that there was a breach in the berm causing water to over top on the western side but the construction is continuing. He stated that they are starting the 1st relief well, ORW 21, on the north side of Hwy 70 on Crawfish Stew St. They are currently running the flow line down Sauce Picante St. which will connect to ORW 21, the well on Gumbo St., Dugas & LeBlanc property, and the flare on Hwy 70. He added that 2 wells were added to the south side of Hwy 70 at Sportsman Landing and are flowing with gas present. The OEP Director stated that the bubbling continues and they have identified 61 sites. Finally, he stated that on May 30, 2013, it will be 1 yr. and there are no signs of diminishing. In response, he stated that DOTD is observing Hwy 70.
19. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee approve adding the following matter to the agenda." The motion was unanimously adopted.
20. Chairman Irving Comeaux requested comments, concerns, or questions regarding the request to discuss matters with Daggs Sewer Treatment Plant. Following three (3) calls, there were no comments.
21. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized Police Juror Calvin James, who stated that with the recent rain, the sewer on Daggs St. in Ward 1 backed up in the homes toward the end near Hwy 70. He then stated that the residents on that Street would like a letter sent to the Governor and all the affiliating agencies requesting that a State of Emergency be declared.
In response, committee member Martin Triche stated that he spoke with Kevin Davidson, who informed him that DHH is not authorized to issue a State of Emergency in the parish.
In response, the OEP Director stated that RS 29761 authorizes the issuance.

22. Following a brief discussion regarding the problem throughout the parish, the committee agreed to authorize the Parish Manager to contact Density and report the problems on Daggs St.
23. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Henry Dupre, "THAT, there being no further business to come before the Engineering/Grants Committee, the meeting be adjourned." The motion was unanimously adopted.

1. The Regular Meeting of the Assumption Parish Police Jury was called to order by President Martin S. Triche in the Assumption Parish Police Jury Chambers located at 4813 Hwy 1, Napoleonville, Louisiana.
2. Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Jeff Naquin, Ward 2; Mr. Irving Comeaux, Ward 3; Mr. Patrick Johnson, Ward 4; Mr. Martin Triche, Ward 5; Mr. Calvin James, Ward 6; Mr. Henry Dupre, Ward 7; Mr. Myron Matherne, Ward 9.
Police Jurors recorded as absent were: Mr. Patrick Lawless, Ward 1; Mr. Booster Breaux, Ward 8.
3. President Martin Triche led the Prayer and Police Juror Calvin James led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.
4. Police Juror Patrick Johnson offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Henry Dupre, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the minutes of May 8, 2013." The motion was unanimously adopted.
5. President Martin Triche opened the meeting to the public for any public comments, questions or concerns regarding the items listed on the agenda. Following three (3) calls, no comments were received.
6. President Martin Triche recognized Drainage Committee Chairman Henry Dupre, who stated that the committee met and recommended the following matters: \$100 for the Labadieville Canal Tree Removal Project, \$4,700 for 158 & 160 Greenleaf Blvd. Culvert Replacement Project, \$3,800 for 604, 711, & 712 Philosopher St. Culvert Replacement Project, \$2,900 for 124 Jolimar St. Culvert Replacement Project, \$500 for 6574 Hwy 1 Stump Removal Project, and \$10,000 from Wards 8 & 9 recreation funds for the Pierre Part Middle School football field subject to the Assumption Parish School Board allowing public use.
7. Police Juror Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Drainage Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted.
8. President Martin Triche stated that the Finance Committee met and recommended the following matters; accept the low bid of \$53,702 from BGS for Air Monitoring Equipment, approved the list of bills submitted through May 17, 2013, received the quarterly report from the Chamber of Commerce and approved the quarterly payment.

ORDINANCE NO. 13-05

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING ALL PREVIOUS ORDINANCES AND ENACTING CURRENT ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH "IDLE-NO WAKE ZONES AND TO DESIGNATE SAID ZONES ALONG CERTAIN WATERWAYS WITHIN THE PARISH OF ASSUMPTION, STATE OF LOUISIANA, AND TO PROVIDE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF.

Pursuant to the authority conferred by L.S.A. R.S. 34:851.25 and 34:851.27 B, the Assumption Parish Police Jury does hereby enact the following ordinance for the operation of motorboats, motor vessels and recreational watercraft on certain waterways within Assumption Parish.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Assumption Parish Police Jury that:

SECTION 1. No person shall operate a motorboat, motor vessel, or recreational watercraft on waterways of Assumption Parish in excess of the posted "IDLE – NO WAKE ZONE" at that location when appropriate and official Police Jury signs giving notice thereof are erected, and they shall be effective at such specific times as may be determined by the Police Jury. Any location where a sign has been erected reading "IDLE – NO WAKE" or "NO WAKE ZONE" or language with the same or similar meaning the maximum speed shall be an "IDLE – NO WAKE SPEED." The "NO WAKE ZONES," in addition to other areas that may be posted, are as follows:

- A. Bayou Corne – On both sides of the bridge to the end of the camps.
- B. Pierre Part Bay – Within 500 ft. of the center of the Pierre Part Bay Bridge in either direction. No wake zone will be in effect beyond the 500 ft. when the water level reaches 3.5 above mean sea level. In addition, no recreational towing (skiing, hydro-sliding, inner tubing, etc.) allowed in the Bay at all times.
- C. Bayou Drive Elevation Bridge - No wake at all times from the bridge to the Bay. No wake within 500 ft. of the center of the bridge North East to the Bayou.
- D. Belle River – Within 1000 ft. of the center of the Belle River (La. Hwy. 70) Bridge in each direction at all times. Unrestricted access beyond the 1000 ft.
- E. Lake Verret – in the vicinity of camps.
- F. Bayou Gannevail – in the vicinity of camps.
- G. Bayou Crab – for a distance (1/4) one-fourth mile from the bridge towards Lake Verret.
- H. Bayou Tranquille – the entire distance of the bayou from beginning to end.
- I. Lake Verret Park Estates Canal – the entire distance of the canal from beginning to end.
- J. T-Bayou.
- K. Pierre Part Bay along East Drive – the entire length of East Drive.
- L. Grand Bayou – 1,000 feet from each side of the bridge.

SECTION 2. The Sheriff of Assumption Parish, the Louisiana Department of Public Safety and Corrections, and the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries are hereby specifically authorized and requested to assist in the enforcement of the provisions of this ordinance.

SECTION 3. Any violation of this ordinance is punishable as a misdemeanor offense with a fine not to exceed \$500.00 and punishment not to exceed 6 months in Parish Jail or both.

SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that if any provision of this ordinance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions, items, or applications of this ordinance, which can be given effect without the invalid provisions, items, or applications, and to this and the provisions of this ordinance are hereby declared severable.

SECTION 5. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are and the same hereby repealed.

SECTION 6. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon posting of signs.
