1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Henry Dupre, Chairman; Mr. Myron Matherne, Mr. Irving Comeaux, Mr. Calvin James, Mr. Booster Breaux, Mr. Martin Triche, Other Police Juror recorded as present was: Mr. Jeff Naquin.
2. Committee member Myron Matherne offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the committee approve the reappointment of all board members to the Northwest Side of Hwy 70 Gravity Drainage District #9." The motion was unanimously adopted.
3. Police Juror Patrick Lawless entered the meeting at this time.
4. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized Police Juror Jeff Naquin, who stated that the drainage funds for Ward 2 were depleted but funding has been approved from Ward 1's allocation. He then explained the outfall project at 3647 Hwy 308. In response, the Parish Manger illustrated exactly what was being done at that location. He proceeded to explain that the outfall project at 3647 Hwy 308 was similar to the previous project. Following a brief discussion, the committee approved.
5. Committee member Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Martin Triche, "THAT, the committee approve \$4,000 for 3739 Hwy 308 Outfall Project and the allocation from Ward 1." The motion was unanimously adopted.
6. Committee member Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Calvin James, "THAT, the committee approve \$4,300 for 3647 Hwy 308 Outfall Project and the allocation from Ward 1." The motion was unanimously adopted.
7. Committee member Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the committee approve \$450 for 3938 Hwy 1 Catchbasin Installation Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
8. Committee member Calvin James offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Martin Triche, "THAT, the committee approve \$2,050 for Grant Loop Outfall Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
9. Chairman Henry Dupre explained the drainage concerns at 2225 Lee Dr. and stated that the residents are requesting assistance. He stated that he will be willing to assist with the project but not until next year.
10. Chairman Henry Dupre stated that the motor on the pump on Hwy 70 has gone out and needs to be replaced. He stated that the cost is \$2,150 and his fund balance is short. In response, committee member Martin Triche agreed to allocate the entire amount from Ward 5's drainage funds.
11. Committee member Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Calvin James, "THAT, the committee approve \$2,150 for the Hwy 70 Pump Motor Replacement Project and the allocation from Ward 5." The motion was unanimously adopted.
12. Committee member Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Calvin James, "THAT, the committee approve \$350 for 116 Derrick St. Culvert Replacement Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.

1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Martin Triche, Chairman; Mr. Patrick Lawless, Mr. Jeff Naquin, Mr. Henry Dupre, Mr. Booster Breaux.  
Other Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Irving Comeaux, Mr. Calvin James, Mr. Myron Matherne.
2. Committee member Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, "THAT, the committee approve to pay the bills submitted through November 8, 2013." The motion was unanimously adopted.
3. Committee member Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, "THAT, the committee approve a one (1) step increase for all employees except Elvin Rapheal, a two (2) step and Anne Blanchard, a three (3) step and a three percent (3%) cost of living raise across the board." The motion was unanimously adopted.
4. Chairman Martin Triche recognized committee member Jeff Naquin, who briefly explained the MPO's (Metropolitan Planning Organization) Metropolitan Transportation Plan and how it affects/benefits portions of Assumption Parish. He stated that the pro-rata share for Assumption would be \$1,400 and recommended payment.
5. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the committee approve the payment of \$1,400 for the pro-rata share of the Houma-Thibodaux MPO's Metropolitan Transportation Plan." The motion was unanimously adopted.
6. Chairman Martin Triche recognized Grants Coordinator Erin Watson, who stated that when a holiday falls during a week with a scheduled event, she would like the Jury to consider payment of overtime for employees who have scheduled to work the event providing they don't miss another day during that week. Following a brief discussion, the committee agreed.
7. Engineering/Grants Committee Meeting  
Of the  
Assumption Parish Police Jury

Wednesday, November 13, 2013  
5:15 O'clock p.m.

1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Irving Comeaux, Chairman; Mr. Henry Dupre, Mr. Patrick Lawless, Mr. Jeff Naquin, Mr. Martin Triche.  
Other Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Calvin James, Mr. Booster Breaux, Mr. Myron Matherne.
2. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the Secretary-Treasurer, who stated that she received the property acquisition/donation documents for Bertrandville Sewer Treatment Plant from South Central Planning requesting that the Police Jury move forward with the closing process. She stated that she would have the ADA review them, and if they are in order, she would request that she move forward and execute.
3. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee authorize the ADA to review the property acquisition/donation documents from Beulah Baptist Church for the Bertrandville Sewer Treatment Plant and execute if they are in order." The motion was unanimously adopted.
4. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the Parish Engineer, who stated that Bridge Holdings, LP is requesting a permit to repair an existing pipeline at the Assumption/Donaldsonville parish line. Committee Member Henry Dupre stated that he would like the Parish Engineer to send a letter requesting their intentions and additional information on when and exact location.
5. Police Juror Patrick Johnson entered the meeting at this time.
6. The Parish Engineer stated that the request is for Hwy 1000 but after reviewing the map, they would be crossing Hwy 999, Hwy 996, and Oilfield Rd. He then stated that he is not sure if the correct fees were remitted for crossing a parish road. Therefore, he would like to table the request for further clarifications and more detailed maps.
7. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Henry Dupre, "THAT, the committee approve a letter of 'No Objection' for the proposed bank stabilization at Ramos Field Facility." The motion was unanimously adopted.
8. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the Special Assistant to the OEP Director, who stated that the owner of farm property on Hwy 1010 in Labadieville is requesting authorization to divide his property into 3 lots. He informed that it's not for developmental purposes and would like to not have to put a waterline and other requirements when doing so.  
In response, the OEP Director informed the committee that this request does not comply with the ordinance. He then stated that the owner would have to put the infrastructure in place before dividing the property because it is not adjacent to the highway.  
A brief discussion was then held regarding the developmental regulations of the ordinance and the need for revision at a meeting in the future.
9. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized committee member Henry Dupre, who stated that this situation is the same as the previous discussion and should be tabled. A discussion was then held regarding the owner being required to put a waterline and a road as required by the ordinance especially for a dirt pit and a farmer selling a tract of land. Following a brief discussion, the OEP Director stated that when a tract of land is not adjacent to a street and basically land locking and the owner not giving them access to a public street. He then stated that if the access would meet the public street, the waterline would not come into play unless development is being done to that property. He then stated that the lot in question does not go all the way to Hwy 1003 but he has a right-of-passage from another lot.
10. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, "THAT, the committee approve a hardship variance of 7 ft. on front set-back for property located at 673 LA Hwy 403." The motion was unanimously adopted.
11. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the Special Assistant to the OEP Director, who stated that the request for placing two rent houses on a piece of property was placed back on the agenda for reconsideration since both lots are adjacent to the highway. In response, the OEP Director again explained the ordinance as it pertains to rental property. A lengthy discussion was then held regarding the subdividing of property, rental property, etc. Mr. Guillot then pointed out to the Jury that across the street from his property is a duplex, two rental properties, on one (1) piece of property. He stated that the waterline should be attached to the development section of the ordinance not the subdividing section. He further stated that he don't think the ordinance makes much sense. A brief discussion was then held regarding the actual plat and the placing of the rental homes, the lot sizes, the location, etc.



12. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, 'THAT, the committee approve reconsideration of the request to place two (2) rental homes on a piece of property located at 5532 LA Hwy 308.'
13. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the Special Assistant to the OEP Director, who stated that the mobile home park located at 247 LA Hwy 1014 meets all requirements and the farmer in the rear has submitted a letter stating that fencing is not required.
14. Committee member Patrick Lawless offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Martin Triche, "THAT, the committee grant final approval for the mobile home park located at 247 Hwy 1014." The motion was unanimously adopted.
15. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the Parish Engineer, who stated that he spoke with the School Board and reviewed the quotes received for Texaco St., Gaudet St., and Convent St. Projects. He stated that the agreed to cost share \$2,500 for Texaco St. Project only. Therefore, the Parish will be responsible for the \$8,500 for Gaudet St., \$4,830 for Convent St. Project, and \$2,500 for Texaco St. Projects.
16. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, 'THAT, the committee approve \$2,500 for Texaco St. Project, \$8,500 for Gaudet St. Project, and \$4,830 for Convent St. Project.' The motion was unanimously adopted.
17. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the Parish Engineer, who stated that the deadline is approaching for submitting the plans and specs for the Critical Infrastructure Project under the Disaster Recovery. He stated that the original estimate submitted by the Jury stated that they would be purchased under state contract. He stated that the State has cancelled its contract and the cost has doubled. Therefore, he explained that they would have to redesign each generator at a cost of an additional \$20,000. He then asked for direction and stated that the companies can't negotiate a price therefore, that the Jury has to publically bid out the generators because the cost is over \$150,000. He also stated that a time extension has been requested from the State but not granted thus far. Following a brief discussion, the committee agreed to have the OEP Director to meet with the Parish Engineer to discuss the matter further.
18. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee approve \$20,000 for the design and specs of the Critical Infrastructure Generator Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
19. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized committee member Henry Dupre, who stated that he met with the PVFD concerning the fire hydrants and a list of 39 new hydrants and locations were submitted. He requested that the money allocated to the Waterworks be doubled so they can catch up on fire hydrants and request a report on the installation.  
A brief discussion was then held regarding the fire hydrants that are requested for installation per year and what is actually installed. In response, the Parish Engineer gave an estimate total of the installation cost to the Waterworks for hydrants and that each department should receive at least three (3) per year.  
A brief discussion was then held regarding the maintenance of the fire hydrants and the additional allocation. Following the discussion, the committee agreed to allow a meeting with the Waterworks to discuss and explain how the funds allocated for fire hydrants are being spent.
20. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized Police Juror Booster Breaux, who stated that there will be a meeting on Monday at 11 a.m. to discuss and review the FEMA maps.
21. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the OEP Director, who stated that there are additional vent wells being installed on Sportsman Drive and proposed wells from Hwy 70 to Sauce Picante St. He stated that the South Berm developed a crack on the east side and down the center. He stated that the center section sunk 2 ½ ft. and sliding toward the north about 2 ft. toward the sink hole. He added that it is continuing to drop and equipment will not be allowed in that area soon. In response, the OEP Director further stated that if a plan is not submitted soon regarding the moving of the south berm, DEQ will send an administrative order to Texas Brine for it to be moved but it has not been provided as of today.
22. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, 'THAT, the following matters be added to the agenda.' The motion was unanimously adopted.
23. Chairman Irving Comeaux requested comments, questions, or concerns regarding the consideration of a project for the LGAP Grant. Following three (3) calls, there were no comments received.
24. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the Grants Coordinator, who stated that the LGAP Grant is due on December 13, 2013 and would like the Jury to consider a project to submit. She reminded them that \$25,000 of the \$100,000 allocation is designated for the Village of Napoleonville.  
Following a brief discussion, the committee agreed to submit the fire hydrants as the project for the LGAP.

25. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Martin Triche, "THAT, there being no further business to come before the Engineering/Grants Committee, the meeting be adjourned." The motion was unanimously adopted.

WHEREAS the Pancreatic Cancer Action Network is the national organization serving the pancreatic cancer community in Assumption Parish and nationwide through a comprehensive approach that includes public policy, research funding, patient services, and public awareness and education related to developing effective treatments and a cure for pancreatic cancer;

WHEREAS the Pancreatic Cancer Action Network and its affiliates in Assumption Parish support those patients currently battling pancreatic cancer, as well as to those who have lost their lives to the disease, and are committed to nothing less than a cure;

A certified copy of said special assessment shall be filed with the Clerk of Court of Assumption Parish, who shall forthwith record same in the Mortgage Records of said Parish. Such assessment when so filed and recorded shall operate as a lien and privilege against the property herein assessed, which lien and privilege shall rank from the date of filing of the assessment in the Mortgage Records of said Parish and shall prime all other claims, mortgages and liens, except taxes and prior recorded special assessment liens.

Section 3. If any section, clause, paragraph, provision or portion of this Ordinance shall be held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not affect any other section, clause, paragraph, provision or portion of this ordinance, the Police Jury of the Parish of Assumption hereby expressly declaring that it would have passed the remaining portions of this Ordinance with the invalid portions omitted.

Section 4. Other ordinances or parts of ordinance in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 5. This ordinance shall become effective immediately.

Section 6. This ordinance, having been submitted in writing, having been read and adopted by sections at a public meeting of said Police Jury was then submitted to an official vote as a whole, then vote thereon being as follows:
