1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Irving Comeaux, Chairman; Mr. Henry Dupre, Mr. Jeff Naquin.
Committee members recorded as absent were: Mr. Patrick Lawless, Mr. Martin Triche.
Other Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Calvin James, Mr. Booster Breaux, Mr. Myron Matherne.
2. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the OEP Director, who stated that the owners at 2005 Hwy 401 are requesting a variance to place a mobile home, which will be used as a camp, 3 ft. and 5 ft. from an existing storage shed. He stated that the request mentioned that the neighbor has no objection but a letter was not submitted. Following a brief discussion, the committee agreed that approval would be granted contingent upon receiving the letter of consent from both neighbors
3. Committee member Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee approve and grant a variance of 3 ft. and 5 ft. from an existing storage shed at 2005 Hwy 401 to put a mobile home/camp contingent upon receipt of the consent letters." The motion was unanimously adopted.
4. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized Ed Stock with C J Savoie's Office, who stated that the contractor for the Sportsman Drive Concrete Road Repairs and the Scott Drive Concrete Repairs has been placed on notice that the contractual documents must be received by December 4, 2015 or the bids will be rescinded and rejected.
5. Committee member Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee approve the placing of S&S Holmes on Public Notice that all contractual documents must be received by December 4, 2015." The motion was unanimously adopted.
6. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Henry Dupre, "THAT, the committee approve a variance of 400 ft. on front setbacks and 500 ft. on side setbacks for a Communication Tower for Entergy Power Corp at 2407 Hwy 308 in Labadieville." The motion was unanimously adopted.
7. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Henry Dupre, "THAT, the committee approve a Communication Tower Permit for Entergy Power Corp." The motion was unanimously adopted.
8. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized Ed Stock with C J Savoie Engineering Firm, who stated that the Hwy 1016-2 Waterline Project is complete and the punch list has been generated and given to the contractor. He then stated that the line is in service and would request approval for substantial completion.
9. Committee member Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee approve and grant substantial completion for Hwy 1016-2 Waterline Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
10. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the OEP Director, who proceeded with the following update on the Disaster Recovery Grants:
 - Cancienne Canal Project – No updates at this time.
 - Bertrandville Sewer Project – Ed Stock with C.J. Savoie's Office, stated that a monthly progress meeting was held and the contractor still continues to run the main sewer lines and the man holes to the parish right of way. He added that the participation to sign up has gotten better.
 - Peterville Sewer Project – Ed Stock stated that the contractor has mobilized in the area and milled the roads. He stated that the lift station and the 1st main hole has been installed.
 - Marais Sewer Project – SCP is collecting the data for the survey to complete the application.
 - Belle River Waterline – Substantial completion was granted and the punch list has been generated and given to the contractor.
 - Sewer Generators Project – Reviewing the project for redesign to fit the budget.
11. The OEP Director then stated that the Bayou L'Ourse Boat Launch change order was previously approved but the minutes reflect a different amount. Therefore, a corrective action is needed for the correct amount which is \$66,276.

12. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Henry Dupre, "THAT, the committee approve to amend the change order for the Bayou L'Ourse Boat Launch to reflect an amount of \$66,276." The motion was unanimously adopted.

- Pump Station Project – Ed Stock stated that bids will be received on January 6, 2016 but is requesting to push the date back to December 8, 2015.
- The Safe Room for the Road & Bridge Department – They have received notice that this project will be approved but the letters will be received by the next meeting. He also stated that he will have an update on the timing of getting the project started.
- Hazardous Mitigation Plan –The Plan comments are coming in and responses are being given. He stated that the deadline is April 2016.
- CIAP Project – Ed Stock stated that they will be meeting with the Corp of Engineers after Thanksgiving to discuss what can be done under the current permit.
- EPA Wastewater Project – This project will be with the Sewer Generator Project and the disaster recovery.
- Belle Rose Library – The designs are about 70% complete.
- Linear Park Project – Ed Stock presented the committee with the new budget based on the site plan in accordance with the Architect. He stated that there are some details that can be worked out with the landscaping, the sitting area, monument, etc He added that the permit will not allow any lighting. He also stated that the budget presented is below the amount but it was based on the recommendations of the scope of work that were submitted for the project.

The Secretary-Treasurer questioned the deadline date of December 2016 that was presented by the OEP Director and stated that at the meeting held about a month ago DNR was very adamant of the deadline date being December 16, 2015 and if the finalized plans had not been submitted by that date, the Parish match will increase to 20% instead of 5%. Following a brief discussion, the committee agreed to accept the budget and approve and submit the plans as presented to stay in compliance with the 5% match.

13. Committee member Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee accept the Linear Park Project budget, approve and submit the plans as submitted." The motion was unanimously adopted.

14. The OEP Director stated that there are no updates on the FEMA appeal.

15. The OEP Director stated that they are continuing to vent gas daily and the largest producer is near the Triche property south of Sportsman Drive. He then stated that the seismic level has gone to code red and is showing on the east side of the sink hole. He then stated that the water in the sink hole is possibly overtopping the low water crossing and there is approximately 6-8 inches of free board with the past rain that we received. The OEP Director stated that Texas Brine is currently using the sink hole water for brine production and the sink hole is being reduced by a little over ½ in. per day. He further stated that he has not heard anything from Texas Brine or Soil conservation regarding any further action.

16. Committee member Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee approve adding the following matters to the agenda." The motion was unanimously adopted.

17. Chairman Irving Comeaux requested comments, questions, or concerns regarding the acceptance of the low bid for the Hwy 398 Boat Launch Project. Following three (3) calls, there were no comments received.

18. Committee member Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee approve and accept the low bid of \$36,751.97 submitted by P & T Turtle Farm for the Hwy 398 Boat Launch Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.

19. Chairman Irving Comeaux stated that bids were received for the Lee Drive Bulkhead Project and the low bid of \$46,228.12 was submitted by P & T Turtle Farm. Following a brief discussion, the committee agreed to table the matter.

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Chairman Irving Comeaux stated that bids were received for the Hwy 70 Bulkhead Project and the low bid of \$25,018.93 was submitted by P & T Turtle Farm. Following a brief discussion, the committee agreed to table the matter.

21. Chairman Irving Comeaux stated that bids were received for the Bertrandville Park Restroom and the low bid of \$59,820 was submitted by Poirrier Construction. He then requested comments,

question, or concerns regarding the low bid received. Following three (3) calls, there were no comments received.

22. Committee member Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee approve and accept the low bid of \$59,820 submitted by Poirrier Construction for the Bertrandville Park Restroom Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.

1. The Regular Meeting of the Assumption Parish Police Jury was called to order by Police Jury President Martin S. Triche in the Assumption Parish Police Jury Chamber, located at 4813 Highway 1, Napoleonville, Louisiana.
2. Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Jeff Naquin, Ward 2; Mr. Irving Comeaux, Ward 3; Mr. Patrick Johnson, Ward 4; Mr. Martin Triche, Ward 5; Mr. Calvin James, Ward 6; Mr. Henry Dupre, Ward 7; Mr. Booster Breaux, Ward 8; Mr. Myron Matherne, Ward 9, Police Juror recorded as absent was: Mr. Patrick Lawless, Ward 1.
3. President Martin Triche led the Prayer and Police Juror Calvin James led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.
4. Police Juror Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the minutes of November 10, 2015 meeting." The motion was unanimously adopted.
5. President Martin Triche opened the meeting to the public for any public comments, questions or concerns regarding the matters listed on the agenda. Following three (3) calls, there were no comments received.
6. President Martin Triche recognized Drainage Committee Chairman Henry Dupre, who stated that the committee met and recommended the following matters; \$3,100 for 140 & 146 Ann St. Culvert Replacement Project, authorized the Parish Engineer to inspect the levee area in Lower Texas to determine what size pump is sufficient for that location, \$8,500 for 6656 Hwy 996 Excavator Project, and \$200 for 3143-A Lee Dr. Culvert Cleaning Project.
7. Police Juror Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Drainage Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted.
8. President Martin Triche recognized Acting Finance Committee Chairman Jeff Naquin, who stated that the committee met and recommended the following matters; payment of the bills submitted through November 20, 2015 and authorized the President to sign the 2015-2017 LIHEAP Contract.
9. Police Juror Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Finance Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached)
10. President Martin Triche recognized Engineering/Grants Committee Chairman Irving Comeaux, who stated that the committee met and recommended the following matters; approved and granted a variance of 3 ft. and 5 ft. from an existing storage shed at 2005 Hwy 401 to put a mobile home/camp contingent upon receipt of the consent letters, placed S&S Holmes on Public Notice that all contractual documents must be received by December 4, 2015, approved a variance of 410 ft. on front setbacks and 500 ft. on side setbacks for a Communication Tower for Entergy Power Corp at 2407 Hwy 308 in Labadieville, approved a Communication Tower Permit for Entergy Power Corp, approved substantial completion for Hwy 1016-2 Waterline Project, received an update on the Disaster Recovery Grants, approved to amend the Bayou L'Ourse Boat Launch change order #1 to reflect an amount of \$66,276, approved the Linear Park Plan estimate of \$268,815, received an update on the Bayou Corne situation, approved the Hwy 398 Boat Launch Project and the low bid of \$36,751.97 from P & T Turtle Farm, and accepted the low bid of \$59,820 from Poirrier Construction for the Bertrandville Restroom Project.

Following a brief discussion, the Secretary-Treasurer informed the newly elected Juror for Ward 6, that if he locates a different facility to host the polling place, it can be further discussed next year.
16. Police Juror Calvin James offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve and adopt an ordinance to amend section 2:52 "Polling Places Established" establishing a new polling place for Ward 6 precinct 1, 1A & 3A." The motion was unanimously adopted. (ordinance attached)
17. President Martin Triche recognized Police Juror Myron Matherne, who requested information regarding multiple locations for early voting.
In response, President Martin Triche stated that this is set up by statute and regulated by the State and there is a limited staff. He further stated that this could probably happen but the Parish would be responsible for funding the operation. He then suggested that a request be made to the Registrar of Voters to get clarification relative to early voting taking place in multiple locations. Also, Police Juror Booster Breaux is requesting clarification on the time change from 6 a.m. to 7 a.m. for voting. In response, the Secretary-Treasurer informed that the Federal Election held on Tuesdays will begin at 6 a.m.
18. Police Juror Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the Police Jury approve and adopt ordinance 15-07 levying grass cutting charges." The motion was unanimously adopted. (ordinance attached)

He then suggested that If the budget runs under the projected estimate, he would like the Engineer to get a cost estimate for repairs to this street and add it to the program.

ORDINANCE NO. 15 - 08

AN ORDINANCE OF THE PARISH OF ASSUMPTION TO AMEND SECTION 2:52 "POLLING PLACES ESTABLISHED", OF SUB-CHAPTER B, "ELECTIONS" OF CHAPTER 2 OF THE ASSUMPTION PARISH CODE OF ORDINANCES SO AS TO ESTABLISH A NEW POLLING PLACE FOR WARD 6 – PRECINCT 1, WARD 6 PRECINCT 1A and WARD 6 PRECINCT 3A.

Be it enacted by the Police Jury of the Parish of Assumption, convened in Regular Session on November 25, 2015, that Section 2:52, "Polling Places Established", of Sub-Chapter B, "Elections", of Chapter 2 of the Assumption Parish Code of Ordinances be hereby amended so as to establish a new polling place for Ward 6 – Precinct 1, 1A AND 3A.

CHAPTER 2

Sub-Chapter B

Elections

SECTION 2:52. POLLING PLACES ESTABLISHED

TO BE REVISED FROM:

ORDINANCE NO. 15 - 09

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR A 3-WAY STOP AT THE CORNER OF MAPLE STREET AND CARDINAL STREET LOCATED IN WARD 2 OF ASSUMPTION PARISH AND TO PROVIDE FOR PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Assumption Parish Police Jury, convened in regular session, this 25th day of November, 2015, that:

Section 1

It is hereby designated that the corner of Maple Street and Cardinal Street located in Ward 2, Parish of Assumption, State of Louisiana, is a "3-WAY STOP" intersection.

Section 2

The proper parish personnel are hereby authorized to erect the necessary placement of "3-WAY STOP" signs at the intersection stated in Section 1 of this ordinance.

Section 3

The Sheriff of this Parish and the Louisiana Department of Public Safety are hereby specifically requested to assist in the enforcement of the provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 4

Any person who violates the provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by imprisonment in the Parish Jail for a period of not more than thirty (30) days or by fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or by both such imprisonment and fine, at the discretion of the Court.

Section 5

If any section, part, paragraph, sentence or clause of this ordinance should be declared invalid or unenforceable, such invalidity or defect shall not affect the remaining sections, parts, paragraphs, sentences, or clauses hereof and, to this end, the several provisions hereof are hereby declared to be severable.

Section 6

All ordinances or parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 7

This ordinance shall become effective immediately.
