Committee members recorded as absent were: Mr. Irving Comeaux and Mr. Patrick Johnson.
Other Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Ron Alcorn and Mr. Henry Dupre.
2. Chairman Jeff Naquin explained that all debris resulting from the tornado in February was brought to this location and was to eventually be dumped at another location and/or burnt. He went on to say that it is time to take action and have the site cleaned up. After a brief discussion, Mr. John Boudreaux of OEP stated that he spoke with the administrator of DEQ and was told that they are aware of the situation. Mr. Boudreaux also stated that he did not receive official confirmation from DEQ just yet, but he believes that the proposed plan for clean-up of the Ezekiel Dump Site will be confirmed. He explained that the bid pricing for tipping fees are to be completed by December of this year. Starting in January, the debris will be separated into different piles and the burn operations will begin. The hauling operations to a landfill will begin in March, and the job is estimated to be completed by May of 2017. The estimated cost of the entire clean-up project is \$400,000, which includes covering the estimated 5-7 workers it'll take to complete this clean-up.
3. President Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, "THAT, the committee approve the Parish Manager to advertise for 30 day bid as required for tipping fees for the cleaning of the Ezekiel Dump Site." The motion was unanimously adopted.
4. Committee member Myron Matherne offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Martin Triche, "THAT, there being no further business to come before the Solid Waste Committee, the meeting be adjourned." The motion was unanimously adopted.

1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Martin Triche, Chairman; Mr. Henry Dupre, Mr. Ron Alcorn, Mr. Jeff Naquin, Mr. Booster Breaux.
Committee member recorded as absent was: Mr. Irving Comeaux.
Other Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Patrick Johnson, Mr. Chris Carter, Mr. Myron Matherne.
2. President Martin Triche stated that the issue of needing room to house juveniles in the parish has surfaced again. He then recognized Judge Jessie LeBlanc of the 23rd Judicial District Court who deals with juveniles in Assumption Parish. Judge LeBlanc stated that other options were needed once our Juvenile Detention Center here closed on July 1st. She expressed that her fear is not having a facility to place a juvenile in if we do not have anything available on a reserved basis in surrounding parishes. She stated that she attempted to contact Mr. Bobby Webber, the new chief deputy of Ascension Parish, for information regarding the making of a possible facility there. She has not heard back from him yet, but will give the jury any updates that she receives.
After a brief discussion regarding the rules and regulations of housing juveniles with Judge LeBlanc, Sheriff Leland Falcon was recognized. He added that while it costs \$22.50 for an adult, it costs \$256 per day to house a juvenile. He went on and stated that instead of seeing juvenile facilities opening, they're seeing facilities closing.
3. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the committee help support the tiering system regarding the housing of juveniles." The motion was unanimously adopted.
4. Committee member Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the committee approve to pay the bills submitted through November 4, 2016." The motion was unanimously adopted.
5. Chairman Martin Triche recognized Mr. Calabro who stated that a letter was received from the Assistant District Attorney asking if we would want to get involved in the Coastal Litigation with the Department of Natural Resources. He proceeded on that he believes it is best to continue researching the situation before getting involved beings he does not see our parish benefiting from it currently. No further action to be taken.
6. Committee member Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Henry Dupre, "THAT, the committee approve to go into an Executive Session regarding the potential litigation relative to the trash cleanup at 196 Virginia St." The motion was unanimously adopted.

66. The Secretary-Treasurer discussed recommendations for 2017 budget cuts. She explained that we've had an extraordinary year of expenditures; therefore, cuts will have to be made. She suggested that some of the Drainage Fund projects that have accumulated over the years and have not been completed for whatever reason should return to the fund balance. The Secretary-Treasurer went on to discuss the General Fund and 1% Sales Tax recommendations. Some recommendations from the General Fund were to reduce recreation allocation to \$10,000 per ward per year, and to discontinue the annual Chamber of Commerce allocation, the annual APS Summer Recreation Program, and the HSA contribution for employees on health plan, JPs, and Constables. A recommendation from the 1% Sales Tax Fund was to reduce the transfer to Library from \$275,000 to \$150,000. The committee expressed that all projects, recreation items, etcetera should be taken up on a priority basis. No further action was to be taken.
67. Committee member Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, there being no further business to come before the Finance Committee, the meeting be adjourned." The motion was unanimously adopted.

1. The Regular Meeting of the Assumption Parish Police Jury was called to order by Police Jury President Martin S. Triche in the Assumption Parish Police Jury Chamber located at 4813 Highway 1 Napoleonville, Louisiana.
2. Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Ron Alcorn, Ward 1; Mr. Jeff Naquin, Ward 2; Mr. Patrick Johnson, Ward 4; Mr. Martin Triche, Ward 5; Mr. Chris Carter, Ward 6; Mr. Henry Dupre, Ward 7, Mr. Booster Breaux, Ward 8; Mr. Myron Matherne, Ward 9.
Police Juror recorded as absent was: Mr. Irving Comeaux, Ward 3.
3. President Martin Triche led the Prayer and Police Juror Chris Carter led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.
4. Police Juror Patrick Johnson offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the minutes of October 26, 2016." The motion was unanimously adopted.
5. President Martin Triche recognized Mrs. Robin Landry of the LA Cooperative Extension Service. She introduced Mrs. Margo Castro, a 4-H Agent, and Mrs. Mariah Simoneaux, a new Agriculture & Natural Resource Agent. She updated the committee by stating that their building renovation is now complete. She presented the jury with copies of the Annual Report. Mrs. Castro was then recognized and advised the jury that we had 5 state winners out of 16 4-H students. They will be traveling to Louisville, Kentucky to represent not only Assumption Parish but the State of Louisiana. Mrs. Simoneaux was then recognized and explained that she's now been working with our parish for a year. She is here two days a week, Wednesdays and Fridays.
6. President Martin Triche recognized Mrs. Jane Boudreaux of Keep Assumption Beautiful, who explained that Dickinson's Witch Hazel Skin Care has donated three plants and one plaque to our community to support National Planting Day efforts. She expressed that they are interested in seeing if the plants can be planted on the courthouse grounds or near the school board office.
7. President Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Johnson, "THAT, the committee approve Keep Assumption Beautiful to meet with Mrs. Theriot and place plants near the Assumption Parish Community Center Pavilion." The motion was unanimously adopted.
8. President Martin Triche opened the meeting to the public for any public comments, questions or concerns regarding the items listed on the agenda. Following three (3) calls, there were no comments received.

11. President Martin Triche recognized Solid Waste Committee Chairman Jeff Naquin, who stated that the Solid Waste Committee met at 4:15pm, discussed the proposed plan for the clean-up of the Ezekiel Dump Site, and recommended the authorization of the Parish Manager to advertise for 30 day bid as required for tipping fees for the cleaning of the Ezekiel Dump Site.
12. Police Juror Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Johnson, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Solid Waste Committee as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted.
13. President Martin Triche stated that the Finance Committee met and recommended/discussed the following matters; payment of the bills submitted through November 4, 2016, a brief update on a letter we received regarding the Coastal Litigation from the Governor's office, authorized the ADA to proceed as advised regarding the trash cleanup at 196 Virginia Street after an Executive Session was held, authorized to help support the tiering system regarding the housing of juveniles after a discussion with Judge Jessie LeBlanc and Sheriff Falcon, approved and accepted the proposed budgets for 2017 and recommended them for publication, and discussed recommendations for budget cuts for 2017.
14. Police Juror Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Johnson, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Finance Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted.
15. President Martin Triche recognized Engineering/Grants Committee Vice-Chairman Henry Dupre, who stated that the Engineering/Grants Committee met and discussed the following matters;

there were no updates made on the Disaster Recovery Grants, Ms. Beryl Gomez updated the jury that they met with a FEMA representative and that the maps will be mailed out to the parish on November 30th, and approved to discuss and deviate on the Grand Bayou Road Project after hearing from two gentlemen with Oxy Chemical but no further action was to be taken at that time.

16. Police Juror Patrick Johnson offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Henry Dupre, 'THAT, the Police Jury approve an occupational license for Supreme Energy Resources, Inc.' The motion was unanimously adopted.
