4:50 O'clock p.m.

1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Henry Dupre, Chairman; Mr. Myron Matherne, Mr. Irving Comeaux, Mr. Booster Breaux.
Committee members recorded as absent were: Mr. Calvin James and Mr. Martin Triche.
2. Committee member Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, "THAT, the committee approve the following drainage overruns; #92323 \$204.72 for culvert replacement at 107 Verda St., #92367 \$486 for erosion control at 114 Verda St., #92310 \$162.40 for catchbasin at 4658 Hwy 1, #92287 \$500 for catchbasin at 147 Pond Drive ." The motion was unanimously adopted.
3. Committee member Mr. Calvin James entered the meeting at this time.
4. Chairman Henry Dupre recognized Cheryl Jacob, 5636 Hwy 996, Belle Rose, LA, who stated that the canals in the Brule St. Martin community, especially that one which is located on Joseph Rivette's property, has not been cleaned out in years and the culvert is clogged, with trash, tree limbs, etc. She then stated that the canal on Hwy 1000 has drums in it causing them to flood. She further stated that they have built levees around their property but because of the clogged canals and the direction in which the water flows they flood with a moderate rain. Ms. Jacobs proceeded to give an update on the other canal located in the surrounding area. In response, Chairman Henry Dupre stated that one of the canals in the surrounding area had been dug/cleaned about 10 yrs ago and there is no way to get to the other canal. He also stated that there have been several other canals dug in that vicinity. He proceeded to explain the diversion project that was done with the grant funds and the canals that were also dug within the scope of the project. Mr. Dupre then stated that the following three projects can assist the community with the drainage problem; request the State to pull up the culvert and install a 24 ft. span bridge, widen the canal on the Rivette's side, shoot some elevations to open Hwy 996 with a smaller culvert, or a levee with a pump. He then requested that they meet and discuss the options before a decision is made.
5. Committee member Martin Triche, Jurors Patrick Lawless and Jeff Naquin entered the meeting at this time.
6. Following the brief discussion regarding the canals in Brule St. Martin, Ms. Jacob invited Mr. Dupre to the property to view all concerns mentioned.
7. Committee member Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Calvin James, "THAT, the committee approve \$1,000 for Gum & Cherry St. Catchbasin Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
8. Committee member Myron Matherne offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the committee approve \$5,260 for Douglas & Jacob St. Culvert Installation Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
9. Committee member Calvin James offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, "THAT, the committee approve \$11,000 for Hwy 1 Outfall Project reallocating the balance from project #91712." The motion was unanimously adopted.
10. Committee member Myron Matherne offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Calvin James, "THAT, the committee approve \$800 for 7174 & 7178 Hwy 1 Catchbasin Projects." The motion was unanimously adopted.

1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Martin Triche, Chairman; Mr. Patrick Lawless, Mr. Jeff Naquin, Mr. Henry Dupre, Mr. Booster Breaux.
Other Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Irving Comeaux, Mr. Calvin James, Mr. Myron Matherne.
2. Chairman Martin Triche recognized the Secretary-Treasurer, who stated that the renewal contract with Roberto Macedo & Associates for the continued administration of Section 8 Program has the same terms and conditions for a two-year term and recommends approval.
3. Committee member Patrick Lawless offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the committee approve the renewal contract with Roberto Macedo & Associates for the continued administration of the Section 8 Program through September 30, 2017." The motion was unanimously adopted.
4. The Secretary-Treasurer stated that the FY 2014-2015 dues for South Central Planning Development Commission is \$8,507.06 which is in line with the past years.
5. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Henry Dupre, "THAT, the committee approve payment of the FY 2014-2015 dues to South Central Planning Development Commission." The motion was unanimously adopted.
6. Chairman Martin Triche recognized committee member Henry Dupre, who stated that there is a strip of property next to the property of the Belle Rose Library and Hwy 998 that would be another access to the Library and the Sheriff's Sub-station. He stated that the land owner is willing to sell and the appraised value is \$32,000. He stated that the property measures about 84 ft. wide and 325 ft. in length. He then requested approval to purchase. In response, the ADA stated that everything is in order and if authorized, he will draft all the documents for approval at the next meeting.
7. Committee member Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, "THAT, the committee approve \$32,000 to purchase additional property for the Belle Rose Library Project through Ward 7 General Fund allocation and authorize the ADA to draft the necessary documents." The motion was unanimously adopted.
8. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the committee approve payment of bills submitted through October 9, 2015." The motion was unanimously adopted.
9. Chairman Martin Triche recognized the Parish Manager, who stated that the culvert cleaner is over 20 yrs old and the parts were difficult to locate therefore, he was looking to piggy back on a neighboring parish to make the purchase of new one. He then stated that he located the parts and made the necessary repairs and its working good therefore, the purchase is not needed at the moment. In response, he stated that he will include the purchase in next yrs. budget.

1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Irving Comeaux, Chairman; Mr. Henry Dupre, Mr. Patrick Lawless, Mr. Jeff Naquin, Mr. Martin Triche.
Other Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Calvin James, Mr. Booster Breaux, Mr. Myron Matherne.
2. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, "THAT, the committee approve and authorize the President to sign the contract with Office of Community Development for electrical upgrades at the Waterworks District #1 Treatment Plant." The motion was unanimously adopted.
3. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the Secretary-Treasurer, who stated that she spoke with the Waterworks Manager, who stated that the Board has agreed to pay the Engineering Fees but didn't address the administration cost. She then stated that the Police Jury would be responsible for the administrative cost which is approximately \$3,000-\$5,000.
4. Committee member Patrick Lawless offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee approve a resolution in support of target areas of Grant Loop & Fertitta St. Waterline Projects for the LCDBG Funding (FY 2016)." The motion was unanimously adopted.
5. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the OEP Director, who stated that a request for a variance on the north side set back of 6 ft. at 334 Bayou Tranquille and the neighbors has no objection.
6. Committee member Patrick Lawless offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee approve a 6 ft. variance on the north side set back at 334 Bayou Tranquille." The motion was unanimously adopted.
7. Committee member Patrick Lawless offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Henry Dupre, "THAT, the committee approve a 6 ft. variance on the rear property line at 3935 Hwy 70 South." The motion was unanimously adopted.
8. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the OEP Director, who stated that the final approval is requested for the division of property into 5 lots belonging to Charles C. Savoie LLC, et al located on LA Hwy 996 in Brule St. Martin. He stated that it meets all requirements and recommends approval.
9. Committee member Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee grant final approval for the division of property into 5 lots belonging to Charles C. Savoie, LLC et al on LA Hwy 996 in Brule St. Martin." The motion was unanimously adopted.
10. Committee member Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Martin Triche, "THAT, the committee approve a 8 ft. variance on the rear property line at 146 Coon Rd." The motion was unanimously adopted.
11. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the OEP Director, who stated that the following is an update on all Disaster Recovery Grants:
 - Cancienne Canal Project – Legal work is still being done by the ADA to seek right of ways.
 - Bertrandville Sewer Project – The contractor has installed the main sewer and trunk line on all streets except Jacob, Pecan, Walker and Bertrand. He then stated that the laterals on Bertand and Matthew Streets will be completed on Friday.
 - Peterville Sewer Project – Pre-construction meeting was held this morning and a notice to proceed was issued to NCMC. The start date is set for November 9, 2015.
 - Marais Sewer Project – South Central Planning is out surveying and has completed about half the area.
 - Ewell/Virginia St. 6" Waterline Project – Ed Stock with the Parish Engineer's Office stated that the Parish will be receiving a credit due to some cost savings. He stated that they are preparing a deduct change order that will be presented at the next meeting.
 - Belle River Waterline – Water line is installed and all the tie ends have been completed except the one at 1016-2. The contractor is continuing with the flushing of the line and coordinating with the Waterworks.
 - Sewer Generators Project – Resetting the budget, going over the plans and making the necessary revisions. Will bid out shortly.

- Pump Station Project – Out for bids. The Parish Engineer is making revisions to the drawings to get the project to come within budget
 - The Safe Room for the Road & Bridge Department – Everything has been submitted and waiting on response.
 - Hazardous Mitigation Plan –The Plan comments are coming in and responses are being given. He stated that the Parish has until next year to complete the plan and then present to the Police Jury for approval.
 - CIAP Project – The Lake Verrett Project budget restraints and designs are being reviewed.
 - Linear Park Project – No new update at the moment.
 - EPA Wastewater Project – This project will be with the Sewer Generator Project and the disaster recovery.
 - Belle Rose Library – The project is still moving forward and waiting on the soil testing results so that the foundation design can be finalized.
12. The OEP Director stated that there was a conference call but he was not on the call therefore, he recognized Ms. Beryl Gomez, who stated that they had a good meeting with Shauna Gibson with FEMA. She stated that they were given the date of October 28, 2015 that the maps will move from sitting to active stage. She then stated that the funding is in place and committed to bringing the project to the production of the preliminary maps into the March/June time frame. Ms. Gibson also informed them that she is working on the funds to complete it once the preliminaries are produced. Once the maps are given to the contractor, they can fine line the details.
13. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the OEP Director, who stated that the voluntary evacuation area was presented at the previous meeting and includes the east side of Grand Bayou as well as the area around the Gator Corner. The area under the mandatory evacuation includes In Link formerly Chevron west to the original line, the southern area south of Gator Corner due to the bubbling that is still in that area. The Sportsman Drive area wells are still under phase II producing a little less than 5,000 cubic ft. daily. The water maintenance are using evaporators to try and evaporate the water from the sink hole. Texas Brine provided a 20 month old graph showing the sinkhole water level history. The MEQ status was 37 on yesterday. The OEP Director stated that DNR website has the last survey posted for review. He then stated that at the previous meeting the discussion consisted of using the sinkhole water for brining and Oxi Chem as being the receiver of brining water and using it to control the water in the contained area. Oxi Chem has requested that Texas Brine perform some analytical on the water especially for bacteria that may be present and cause corrosion. He stated that Oxi Chem believes that following the results the water can be treated and through modification they can use the sinkhole water in brine production.
14. Committee member Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, ‘THAT, there being no further business to come before the Engineering/Grants Committee, the meeting be adjourned.’ The motion was unanimously adopted.

1. The Regular Meeting of the Assumption Parish Police Jury was called to order by Police Jury President Martin S. Triche in the Assumption Parish Police Jury Chamber, located at 4813 Highway 1, Napoleonville, Louisiana.
2. Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Patrick Lawless, Ward 1; Mr. Jeff Naquin, Ward 2; Mr. Irving Comeaux, Ward 3; Mr. Patrick Johnson, Ward 4; Mr. Martin Triche, Ward 5; Mr. Calvin James, Ward 6; Mr. Henry Dupre, Ward 7; Mr. Booster Breaux, Ward 8; Mr. Myron Matherne, Ward 9,
3. President Martin Triche led the Prayer and Police Juror Calvin James led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.
4. Police Juror Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the minutes of September 23, 2015 meeting." The motion was unanimously adopted.
5. President Martin Triche opened the meeting to the public for any public comments, questions or concerns regarding the matters listed on the agenda. He recognized Ms. Jane Boudreaux, Keep Assumption Beautiful, who presented the Jury with litter bags and requested authorization to pass out bags on Hwy 70 & Spur and the Red Light in Napoleonville on November 14, 2015. In response, President Martin Triche stated that provided that a can shake is not scheduled for that date, it would be permissible.
President Martin Triche then recognized Raymond Blanchard, 138 Redwood St., Labadieville, who stated that the dry hydrants that were located at the bridge in Lower Texas and Bayou Crab have not been replaced following the replacement of the bridges. He stated that those are within their fire rating and if inspected, and they are not replaced, it will affect their rating. Therefore, he would like to request that the replacement hydrants be horizontal instead of vertical.
In response, President Martin Triche stated that those hydrants were installed through grant funding and the bridges were replaced by the State therefore, the request would need to be made to the State for funding to replace the hydrants.
6. Police Juror Patrick Johnson offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the Police Jury send a resolution requesting LADOTD to replace the dry hydrants near the Bayou Crab and Lower Texas Bridges." The motion was unanimously adopted.
7. Mr. Blanchard also stated that he would like to see the hydrant that is located about ½ mile from the Lower Texas Bridge extended up to the bridge to make it beneficial to those homes in that area.
8. In response, President Martin Triche approved to deferred comments regarding the Firing Range following that discussion. Following three (3) calls, there were no further comments received.
9. President Martin Triche recognized Drainage Committee Chairman Henry Dupre, who stated that the committee met and recommended the following matters; approved the following drainage overages, #92323 \$204.72 for culvert replacement at 107 Verda St., #92367 \$486 for erosion control at 114 Verda St., #92310 \$162.40 for catchbasin at 4658 Hwy 1, #92287 \$500 for catchbasin at 147 Pond Drive, discussed the canals in Brule St. Martin and requested a resolution to DOTD to replace the 8 ft. culvert with at least a 25 ft. span bridge at 5636 Hwy 996, \$1,000 for Gum & Cherry St. Catchbasin Project, \$5,260 for Douglas & Jacob St. Culvert Installation Project, \$11,000 for Hwy 1 Outfall Project reallocating the balance from project #91712, \$800 for 7174 & 7178 Hwy 1 Catchbasin Projects, \$950 for 1925 & 1922 Hwy 70 Outfall Dredging Project, \$1,850 for 6682 Hwy 996 Culvert Replacement Project, \$2,300 for 7546 Hwy 1 Catchbasin Project, \$1,050 for 114 Brothers St. Outfall Project, \$1,500 for 656 Belle River Rd. Pump Replacement Project reallocating the funds from project #92207, \$300 for Hwy 401 Outfall Project, and \$500 for 129 Daniel St. Catchbasin Project.
10. Police Juror Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Drainage Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached)
11. President Martin Triche stated that the Finance Committee met and recommended the following matters; contract renewal with Roberto Macedo & Associates for the continued administration of the Section 8 Program through September 30, 2017, payment of the FY 2014-2015 dues to South Central Planning Development Commission, \$32,000 to purchase additional property for the Belle Rose Library Project through Ward 7 General Fund allocation and authorize the ADA to draft the necessary documents, and payment of bills submitted through October 9, 2015.

12. Police Juror Patrick Johnson offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Finance Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted.
13. President Martin Triche recognized Engineering/Grants Committee Chairman Irving Comeaux, who stated that the committee met and recommended the following matters; authorized the President to sign the contract with Office of Community Development for electrical upgrades at the Waterworks District #1 Treatment Plant, approved a resolution in support of target areas of Grant Loop & Fertitta St. Waterline Projects for the LCDBG Funding (FY 2016), 6 ft. variance on the north side set back at 334 Bayou Tranquille, a 6 ft. variance on the rear property line at 3935 Hwy 70 South, granted final approval for the division of property into 5 lots belonging to Charles C. Savoie, LLC et al on LA Hwy 996 in Brule St. Martin, 8 ft. variance on the rear property line at 146 Coon Rd., received an update on the Disaster Recovery Grants, the FEMA appeals and the Bayou Corne situation.
14. Police Juror Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Henry Dupre, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Engineering/Grants Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolutions attached)
15. President Martin Triche stated that a Public Hearing was held regarding the proposed operation of Bayou Automotive, LLC Towing Storage Facility to be located at 5840 Highway 1 In the Paincourtville Community. He stated that no comments were received.
16. Police Juror Patrick Lawless offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Johnson, "THAT, the Police Jury enter into executive session to discuss settlement negotiations with representing Counsel relative to Daigle vs APPJ case #033646." The motion was unanimously adopted.
17. Police Juror Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Henry Dupre, "THAT, the Police Jury resume regular session." The motion was unanimously adopted.
18. President Martin Triche stated that the Police Jury entered into executive session to discuss settlement negotiation relative to Daigle vs APPJ case #033646 with the retained Counsel and the ADA. He then requested a motion authorizing the retained Counsel and the ADA to settle the matter in accordance with the terms deemed advisable.
19. Police Juror Myron Matherne offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve and authorize the retained Counsel and the ADA to settle the matter relative to Daigle vs APPJ case #033646 in accordance with the terms deemed advisable." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached)
20. President Martin Triche recognized the Parish Manager, who stated that Lawrence Cole Jr. has successfully completed his probationary period and recommends approval.
21. Police Juror Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Johnson, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the probationary period for Lawrence Cole Jr." The motion was unanimously adopted.(resolution attached)
22. President Martin Triche stated that there was a recent case regarding the noise violation and the Judge found the complainant guilty at the trial level however, there was some reference to decibel readings and having some objective way to determine or quantify the sound. He then stated that there was a recommendation from the Sheriff's personnel that the parish look towards identifying or quantifying a particular decibel reading so that if a violation would occur it's not a matter of judgment. He then recognized ADA Michael Calabro, who stated that he has a draft prepared and the Jury would have to call a public hearing or set up a meeting to determine what the next step should be to proceed. In response, he stated that the draft incorporated measures of surrounding parishes. He then suggested that the Police Jury go out into the field and determine what is appropriate under the Parishes circumstances and make a determination from what is gathered.
President Martin Triche stated that the Jurors will receive the draft and at the next meeting review and come up with a proposal to call for a public hearing.
In response, ADA Michael Calabro stated that based upon the new issue with fireworks, fire arms/shooting rounds, parameters, etc. this matter will need to be further discussed.
President Martin Triche suggested that the draft includes issues relative to fireworks, shooting rounds, etc, and how they are addressed in neighboring parishes. In response to hunting as it relates to the noise ordinance, Mr. Triche stated that it would have to be repetitive, magnified, etc.
23. President Martin Triche recognized Police Juror Myron Matherne, who stated that he received numerous complaints regarding high powered rifle shooting through the area of the Oaks, the noise and the safety of the people in the area. He stated that he requested that the Sheriff and the ADA look into the matter and see what can be done.
In response, the ADA stated that the present ordinance is just the general discharge of fire arms and the way that it is phrased is really what creates the situation of it being problematic. He proceeded to review a statement from the ordinance and stated that what he believes needs to be firmed up is the categorization of how do you determine where that fire arm is discharged. He then stated that what was just brought before him is the potential shooting range which makes

that a whole new problematic situation that needs to be addressed and would definitely change the parameters of the discussion.

President Martin Triche recognized Mr. Guy Boudreaux who resides in the Oaks, who stated that this complaint has been made before and the ordinance has never been revised to where it can be understood. He stated that these people shoot almost every weekend and the home that was just built is closer to where the shooting takes place and anyone can come out and witness it and would not want to live there. He stated that the shooting is continuous for hours. He also stated that the State has a noise ordinance and the EPA has laws regarding depositing lead which has never been addressed. He further stated that if the shooting is done in wetlands, then a whole new ballgame is unveiled because this lead is being released in the waterways. Mr. Boudreaux then stated that to have a shooting range with no restrictions, no berm, no public protection and firing across a waterway. In response to just leisure hunting, Mr. Boudreaux stated that hunting would not be a problem, but it's the high caliber shooting, shooting things that blow up, etc. and all of it is legal.

President Martin Triche stated that the state has a range manual and it's very stringent. In response, the ADA stated that he will need more input on this matter from the Jury and the Sheriff's Office to determine what would be the next step feasible to take. A wide range of issues have been covered and in order to encompass everything, it will take some time.

President Martin Triche informed that at present time, there is no local ordinance or restrictions governing firing ranges.

President Martin Triche recognized Travis Rhodes, 314 6th St., Morgan City, LA, who informed the Jury of the owners of the Michels property and stated that he has been hunting on the property for 40 yrs. He stated that they hunt and do recreational shooting on this property, he has been a NRA member since the age of 13 and he is an x-ray technician and as a tech, he described the type of accidents he runs across. He proceeded to explain what happened in 2006 when the matter was first addressed and he was not able to attend the public hearing. He then stated that if it hadn't been for the Sheriff's Office he would not have known about this meeting because the Juror for the ward didn't make an attempt to notify him. In response, he stated that they engage in recreational shooting on the property and is on the property at least once a week during the months of October and November in the middle of the day. He stated that there is a pump in the area that creates much noise and that is not being addressed. He also stated that the lead mentioned is not a factor and there is a 10ft. berm along the Michel canal. He stated that it's funny how they don't see and complain about the people that's throwing trash on their property. Mr. Rhodes mentioned his nephews who went to Iraq and qualified as experts because of their training in Belle River. In response, he stated that there are public ranges in Morgan City but most times it's locked. He stated that he would not have a problem living next to a firing range. He then presented the Jury with a copy of State Law which relates to owners of 5 or more acres of unincorporated land that clears him of any violation. He also stated that the Parish should address the law of trespassing because their property is posted and fenced in. He ended by stating that they take every precaution possible to insure the safety of all people.

President Martin Triche assured Mr. Rhodes that this will be given to the ADA and will be addressed along with his recommendations to the Jury and incorporated in the revised ordinance.

President Martin Triche recognized Pat Gaudet, landowner next to the shooting area, who stated that if there is shooting going on in that area every weekend, it's not by the property owners. He stated that he goes out to the area once a month and shoots 200 rounds. He added that his family has owned the 40 acres of property for 100 yrs. He stated that according to the Parish law, they are not violating anything and the noise ordinance doesn't take effect until 10 p.m. and they are not shooting at that time of night. He stated that there is a back stop they shoot into. He further stated that he is tired of going on his property and being harassed by the Sheriff's Office. Mr. Gaudet then stated that if there is shooting every weekend he would like the Sheriff's office to go out and arrest whoever is trespassing and if there are four wheelers on their property, no matter who they are, he wants them arrested also. He further stated that they should be grandfathered in even after the ordinance is amended.

President Martin Triche recognized Brett Michel and Matthew Michel, 1805 Victor Two Blvd. Morgan City, who stated that they grew up in the Belle River woods. He stated that they were Eagle Scouts, have extensive fire arm training, 8 yrs. of service in the Marines and they fought for this type of rights. He stated that safety is a very important issue. He gave an over view of his years in the Marines and stated that safety is the highest priority of the US Government especially on a live range. He then stated that there are three (3) authorized persons on the property (Matthew, Travis Rhodes and himself) and if any other person is caught out there, the trespassing law should be upheld. In response, he stated that the area is gated/fenced and posted all around.

President Martin Triche recognized Cpt. Ray Traigle, who stated that he contacted Ms. Svaboda because her track of land was closest to the complainant. He then stated that he visited the site and found that one of the firing areas was less than 300 ft. and they informed that it would be moved. He stated that some of the residents mentioned the noise ordinance and after speaking with Mr. Calabro, that matter will be addressed shortly. He reiterated that that the last noise ordinance violation ruled in court in the Sheriff's favor but the question did arise as to why was the office using such an old ordinance when the statue was more updated. He stated that the department will be purchasing decimal meters. He then stated that the Sheriff Department wants to make this matter as fair as possible for all bars in the Parish.

President Martin Triche recognized Vanessa Boudreaux, who stated that she doesn't know the owners and they complained years ago when their kids were young. She then stated that because the owners practice safety first but what are the trespassers practicing. She further stated that the only complaint she made was regarding an explosion that happened near their

home and when the Sheriff's Deputy knew exactly what it was, handled the matter, and it never occurred again.

President Martin Triche stated that the Police Jury needs to better define some of the issues that are unclear so that the enforcement can be objective. He then stated that the Jury's ADA will research the surrounding parish's ordinance, review the updated state statute, present some recommend language to the Jury for review and then hold a public hearing.

President Martin Triche recognized Ms. Toni M. Svoboda, who stated that this has been family property for many years. She stated that when the developer of that subdivision bought the property and promised to fence it off but never did. She stated that she was almost arrested for trying to stop the shooting in the private canal but then she received a letter regarding firing in the canal and she should take control of the situation. She further stated that it's not her and that she is in her legal rights on her property.

24. Police Juror Calvin James offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the Police Jury approve an occupational license for ABT, Home Improvements, Big A Trailers, Etc. LLC, Kajos Seafood, Pop's Food, Frosty Corner, Diamond Jim's Casino – ownership change, Go-Bears #27 – ownership change, and Bayou Automotive, LLC contingent upon the installation of the fence." The motion was unanimously adopted.
25. Police Juror Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve a resolution to DOTD requesting a School Bus Stop Ahead sign between Lee Dr. & Lawes St. on Hwy 70," The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached)
26. President Martin Triche recognized Police Juror Irving Comeaux, who stated that the condition of Hwy 662 is worsening each time it rains. He stated that the motorists are dodging the holes and a teenage girl died due to a head on collision with a cane trailer truck on this highway. He then suggested that a resolution be sent to the State requesting that they go out and inspect the areas in question.
27. Police Juror Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve a resolution to the State requesting that they inspect Hwy 662 and consider making the necessary repairs before tragedy occurs." The motion was unanimously adopted.
28. President Martin Triche recognized Police Juror Jeff Naquin, who requested that a resolution be sent to the State requesting that they transfer La. Hwy 645 in its entirety, approximately 2.25 miles, from DOTD to the Parish and the related conditions as presented. He proceeded to explain that he would request the road from LA 1 to the old railroad track be black topped. A brief discussion regarding not accepting the portion that is not being brought up to parish standards.
29. Police Juror Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Henry Dupre, "THAT, the Police Jury approve a letter to the LADOTD requesting they consider black topping the portion from LA 1 to the old railroad track on LA 645 and allow the Police Jury to take over only that portion from the State." The motion was unanimously adopted.
30. Police Juror Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the 1st phase of the derelict structure procedure for the dwelling located at 106 Lincoln St." The motion was unanimously adopted.
31. Police Juror Patrick Lawless offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the 1st phase of the derelict structure procedure for the dwelling located at 152 Freetown Lane." The motion was unanimously adopted.
32. President Martin Triche recognized the Secretary-Treasurer, who announced the receipt of \$4,494,000 in VA compensation and pension to 1,442 Assumption Parish Veterans and their families for FY 2014. She mentioned that in 2013 the funds totaled \$3,711,000.
33. Patrick Lawless offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Johnson, "THAT, the Police Jury approve Trick or Treat hours on Saturday, October 31, 2015 from 5 p.m. until 7 p.m." The motion was unanimously adopted.
34. Police Juror Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, "THAT, the Police Jury approve a liquor license application for Gaubert Food Marts, Inc, Go Bears #27 and Diamond Jim's Casino." The motion was unanimously adopted.
35. President Martin Triche recognized the Parish Engineer, who stated that Shane St. has a 200 ft. section that needs repairing. He stated the cost is between \$15,000 - \$20,000. Following a brief discussion, President Martin Triche suggested that the Parish Engineer present a budgetary report of the 2015 Improvement Program at the next meeting before an approval is given.

36. Police Juror Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, 'THAT, there being no further business to come before the Assumption Parish Police Jury, the meeting be adjourned.' The motion was unanimously adopted.
